Placing a scarecrow in your garden is the traditional way of deterring birds from raiding your delicious crops.

Modern day alternatives include visual scare devices like balloons with painted eyes or reflective material, such as an old CD that shines in the sun while twisting in the wind. Bird netting and motion-activated sprinklers can also be effective.

When the birds hear these sounds they think the flock is in trouble and flee.
