

Housing, Income and Support Inventory 2007

Introduction

The 2007 Homeless Inventory has been updated based on the previous inventory completed in 2003. Its main purpose is to comply with the Community Plan Assessment required by HRSDC as part of the wrap up of the National Homelessness Initiative (NHI). It combines the general homeless inventory (adult) with the formerly separate youth and Aboriginal homeless inventories and consists of three separate inventories of housing, income and support services.

Some changes have been made to the 2007 Inventory compared to the 2003 Inventory. Two new columns have been added to identify the source of funding and the year started, where available. The former was done to help with the Community Plan Assessment and the latter to help identify newly added or opened housing, income and services. In the support inventory, an additional column for beds/units has been added and completed where appropriate.

There are inevitably grey areas where a project does not fall neatly into one section, and we have had to make a decision as to categorization. Further, a project may offer two or more services, for example, transitional housing also offering outreach services. In these situations, if the services are offered both to housing residents and others not living in the housing project, they are included in both categories.

Scope

The inventory focuses on housing, income and support services that are either targeted to homeless and at-risk persons, or serving predominantly homeless and at-risk persons. As such this is not an inventory of all housing, income and support services offered in the region. For a more comprehensive list, please see the REDBOOK Online.

Period covered

The inventory has been updated to reflect conditions as of January 1, 2007. New projects or initiatives that have started or opened since then will be captured in the next update of the inventory. Similarly, projects or initiatives that have closed since then may still be in the inventory.

Accuracy

Housing Inventory

The material for this section was compiled from the previous inventory with updated information provided by BC Housing, Vancouver Coastal Health Authority, Fraser Health Authority and Cold Wet Weather Strategy staff. Please note that social housing data include only those housing projects that have a relationship with BC Housing. Where social housing operating agreements have expired and/or BC Housing has no oversight role, these projects may not be included.

The housing types included are:

- Cold wet weather strategy (CWWS) beds
- Emergency shelters for adults
- Extreme Weather Response sites
- Permanent social housing
- Rental Assistance Program (new rent sup program)
- Second stage housing for women and children fleeing violence
- Supported Independent Living Program (SILP) and SILP for youth
- Singles housing built under Low Income Urban Singles (LIUS) program and Homeless At Risk (HAR)
- Supportive housing targeting homelessness

- Transition houses for women and children fleeing violence
- Transitional housing including youth transitional housing
- Youth agreements
- Youth emergency shelters and safe houses.

Not included:

- group homes and facilities providing shelter and care through the child welfare system,
- mental health short stay housing and care facilities that require referral through the mental health system,
- group homes for persons with mental health issues.

A draft version of the support inventory was sent to community representatives for comments and feedback on errors and omissions and it was amended to reflect those changes.

Support inventory

The support component of the 2006 Inventory was updated by requesting updated information from major service providers like Vancouver Coastal Health Authority, Fraser Health Authority, and municipal planners. The SCPI project list provided by HRSDC was also used to incorporate SCPI funded initiatives, as were recent local inventories prepared in Surrey and the Tri Cities. A draft version of the support inventory was sent to community representatives for comments and feedback on errors and omissions and it was amended to reflect those changes.

The support types included are:

- Youth - Emergency/Crisis Services
- Youth - Support, counselling & life skills
- Youth - Sexual abuse

Not included:

- Adult general social services like counselling, life skills, sexual abuse, family support etc

Income inventory

The material for this section was compiled from the previous 2003 inventory with updated information provided by the Ministry of Employment and Income Assistance and Service Canada. There has been some change in this sector. Several additions have been included; however, an effort has been made to ensure that the listings included all provide services or programming to people who are homeless and those at risk of homelessness.
