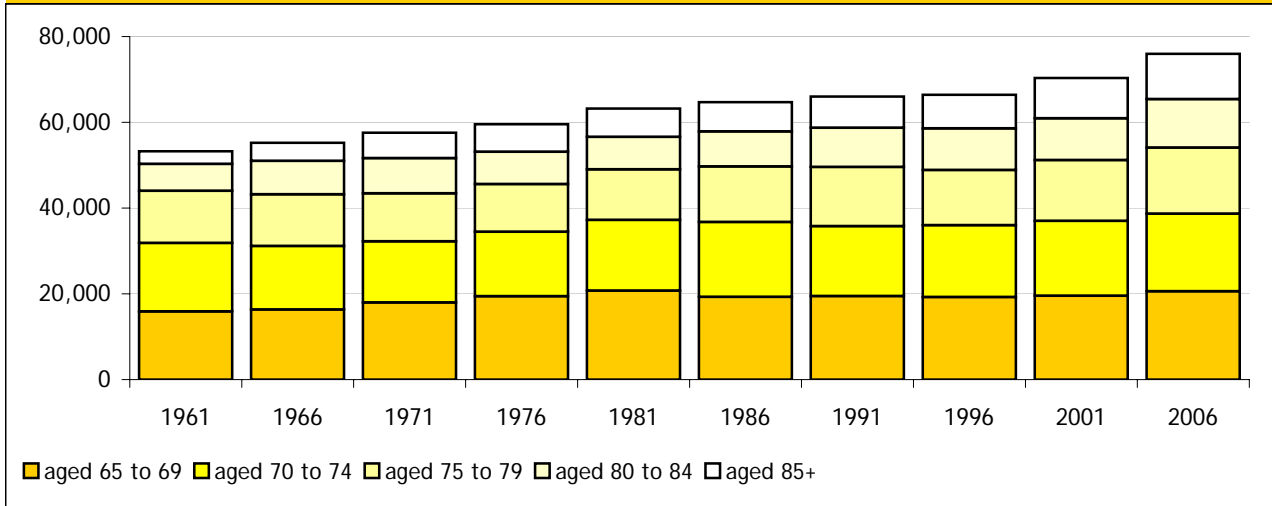
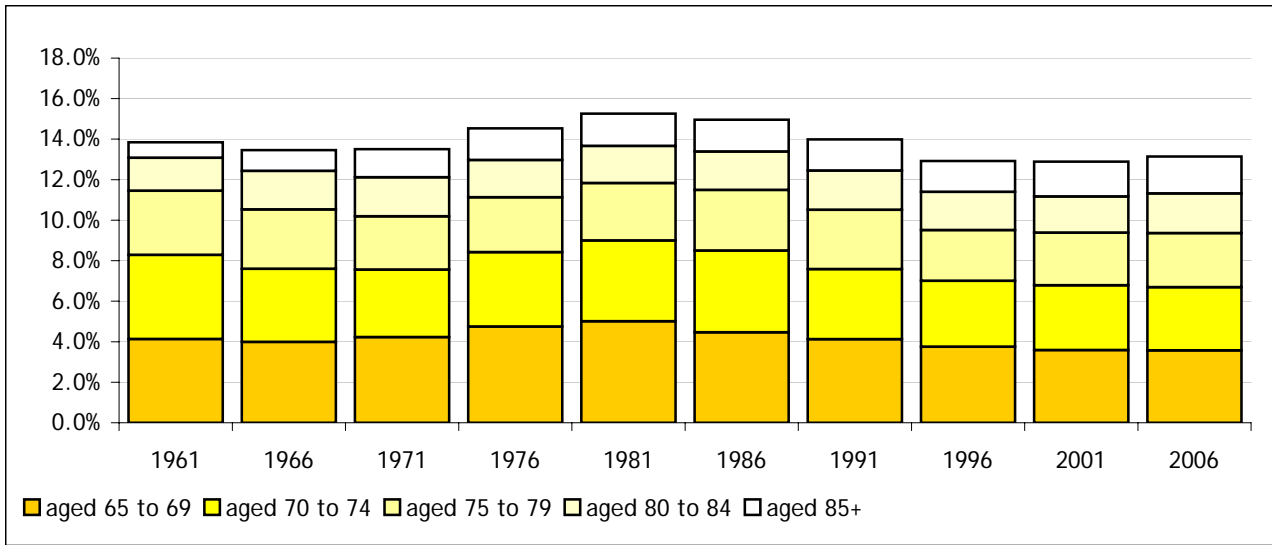


# CityFacts Census Data Series

## Aged 65+, 1961-2006



The chart shows the numbers of seniors in the city in 5-year age groups, with data from 10 census periods between 1961 and 2006.



This chart shows that the percentage of the population aged 65 and over rose from 1961 to 1981 to 15% of the population, but has fallen slightly since then.

Although the percentage of the population in these age groups is about the same, because the total population increased between 1961 and 2006 there were 22,700 more seniors in 2006 than in 1961. This pattern of change is quite different from the national average,
