## Notice of Election for 2002 general local elections

On November 16, 2002, from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m., you'll be asked to elect a Mayor, 10 Councillors, nine School Trustees and seven Park Board Commissioners for a three-year term (December 2002 to December 2005).

You will also be asked to vote on three questions about the City's 2003-2005 Capital Plan. A summary of the questions is on the facing page.

### Voter Registration

Residents not already registered on the City's List of Electors may register at the time of voting if they meet the qualifications, can show proper identification, and complete and sign the required application form. To register you must be:

- 18 years of age or older on general voting day
- a Canadian citizen
- a resident of B.C. for at least six months immediately preceding the day of registration
- a resident of Vancouver for at least 30 days immediately preceding the day of registration
- not otherwise disqualified by law from voting.

To register at the time of voting you must show two pieces of identification (at least one with a signature). Here are the kinds of ID that are acceptable:

- B.C. Driver's Licence
- B.C. ID card
- ICBC Owner's Certificate of Insurance and Vehicle Licence
- B.C. Care Card
- Ministry of Social Development and Economic Security Request for Continued Assistance Form SDES8
- Social Insurance card
- Citizenship Card
- property tax notice

- credit card or debit card
- utility bill for electricity, gas, water, telephone or cable services
- welfare cheque stub showing name and ID number.

### Where to Vote

On voting day, you must vote at the voting place for the voting division in which you currently live. Non-resident property electors vote in the voting division in which the property is located.

You should have received a "Where to Vote Card" in the mail telling you exactly where to vote in your neighbourhood on November 16, 2002. You will also get an election brochure delivered to your doorstep in the first week of November, which has detailed information about the upcoming elections.

This brochure also contains a map showing the voting division boundaries and a list of all voting locations. The brochure will also be available at libraries and community centres.

# The Capital Plan borrowing questions on the ballot

\$96.7 million of funding for the 2003-2005 Capital Plan is proposed to come from borrowing that requires voter approval.

During the general municipal election on November 16, you will be asked to give Council the authority to borrow these funds. Eligible voters may vote yes or no to the following three questions on borrowing:

## 1.

### PUBLIC WORKS, PUBLIC SAFETY AND CIVIC FACILITIES \$78,100,000

This portion of the Capital Plan targets funds to replace aging infrastructure projects as it wears out, and to provide some new facilities to address safety and environmental issues and to meet new demands.

This is the first Capital Plan borrowing question you will see on your ballot:

**Are you in favour of Council having the authority, without further approval of the electors, to pass bylaws between January 1, 2003 and December 31, 2005 to borrow an aggregate seventy eight million one hundred thousand dollars (\$78,100,000) for the following purposes?**

#### A. Streets and Bridge Infrastructure \$16,107,000

To reconstruct arterial and residential streets and lanes; and to complete bicycle and pedestrian improvements and other major maintenance and upgrading on the City's bridges.

#### B. Pedestrian and Cycling Facilities \$15,295,000

To provide sidewalks, bikeways, curb-ramps, walkways, and other facilities in public corridors and open spaces to develop a City-wide network that emphasizes pedestrian and bicycle movements.

#### C. Transit and Safety Improvements \$11,589,000

To provide facilities that improve traffic safety and transit services, including improvements to arterial streets and construction of left-turn bays, major maintenance and modifications to existing traffic signals and the construction of new traffic and pedestrian signals.

#### D. Local Area Improvements \$12,379,000

To provide for neighbourhood traffic initiatives that reduce through-traffic in neighbourhoods; to provide the City's share of local improvement projects on streets and lanes, including construction of new curbs and gutters, installation of new street and lane lighting, and to provide other beautification features.

#### E. Street Lighting and Communications \$6,265,000

To provide for the replacement of street lighting components that are worn out; to improve street and lane lighting to maintain public safety; and to maintain and upgrade the City's communications systems.

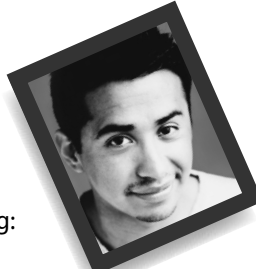
#### F. Public Safety \$9,620,000

To provide for replacement of facilities for the Vancouver Police Department including development of a coordinated training facility.

#### G. Civic Facilities \$6,845,000

To provide for the replacement and rehabilitation of civic facilities which are beyond economical repair and no longer meet operational needs, including replacement and upgrading of Mt. Pleasant Branch Library and rehabilitation of public works yards.

If this question receives the assent of the electors, Council has the power, without further assent of the electors, to pass bylaws, as and when Council considers appropriate, to borrow money for the projects described up to seventy eight million one hundred thousand dollars (\$78,100,000).



## 2.

### PARKS AND RECREATION FACILITIES \$18,690,000

To maintain the quality of Vancouver's park and recreation facilities, we need to update, repair or replace existing facilities, and provide additional amenities and programs.

This is the second Capital Plan borrowing question you will see on your ballot:

**Are you in favour of Council having the authority, without further approval of the electors, to pass bylaws between January 1, 2003 and December 31, 2005 to borrow an aggregate eighteen million six hundred ninety thousand dollars (\$18,690,000) for the following purposes?**

#### A. Recreation Facilities \$14,920,000

To provide for major maintenance, upgrading, replacement or expansion of community centre facilities, ice rinks, field houses, community pools, including Killarney pool, and other parks and recreation facilities.

#### B. Park Development \$3,770,000

To provide for the improvement or development of City-wide and neighbourhood parks, shorelines, sport fields and playgrounds; to continue the planting of street trees in City neighbourhoods; to provide for maintenance and upgrading of major parks including Stanley Park and Queen Elizabeth Park.

If this question receives the assent of the electors, Council has the power, without further assent of the electors, to pass bylaws, as and when Council considers appropriate, to borrow money for the projects described up to eighteen million six hundred ninety thousand dollars (\$18,690,000).

## 3.

### COST-SHARED INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS - CITY SHARE \$20,000,000

The federal and provincial governments and other outside funders have programs that provide cost sharing for municipal capital projects. The City may be eligible to access their cost sharing during the 2003-2005 Capital Plan.

This question seeks authority to borrow funds to be used in providing the City share of funding for capital works that receive a majority of their funding from senior governments or other outside sources.

This is the third Capital Plan borrowing question you will see on your ballot:

**Are you in favour of Council having the authority, without further approval of the electors, to pass bylaws between January 1, 2003 and December 31, 2005 to borrow up to an aggregate twenty million dollars (\$20,000,000) to fund the city share of public works, parks and recreation or other civic projects that receive a majority of their funding from senior governments or other outside sources?**

If this question receives the assent of the electors, Council has the power, without further assent of the electors, to pass bylaws, as and when Council considers appropriate, to borrow money for the projects described up to twenty million dollars (\$20,000,000).
