

# It's your city... vote November 16

## Special Voting Opportunities for 2002 general local elections

If you have a physical disability, illness or injury that will affect your ability to vote on November 16 (or at an advance poll), the City of Vancouver offers two options:

- mail ballot voting
- special voting at care facilities.

### Mail Ballot Voting

If you meet the above requirements, you can vote by mail. Contact the Vancouver Election Office at 604.873.7489 for details on obtaining a mail ballot application.

Mail ballot packages will be mailed on November 6 and must be returned to the Election Office before 8 p.m. on November 16. (You can arrange to have someone pick up your ballot package and return it for you, if your representative provides the Election Office with your written permission.)

### Special Voting at care facilities

Patients in acute care hospitals or residents in medical care facilities may be able to vote where they are located. City staff will administer voting at Vancouver care facilities November 4-15. Look for the City notice posted in your facility, or contact the Election Office at 604.873.7489 for more information.
