10 Things To Know

1. The City of Vancouver General Local Election is on:
Saturday, November 15, 2008, from 8 am – 8 pm.
2. You are voting for: 1 Mayor, 10 Councillors,
7 Park Commissioners and 9 School Trustees.
You are also voting on several borrowing questions.
3. You are allowed to vote in the City of Vancouver
General Local Election if you are:
 - a resident elector (i.e. you live in Vancouver)

OR

 - a non-resident property elector (i.e. you live else
where in B.C., but you own property in Vancouver).

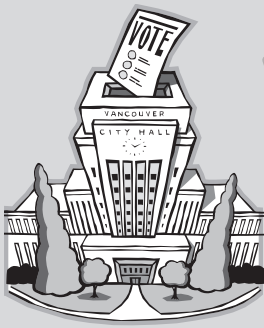
You must meet **ALL** of the following requirements
to vote:

- i. Be 18 years of age or older on General
Voting Day.
 - ii. Be a Canadian citizen.*
 - iii. Have been a resident of B.C. for at least
six months immediately before you register
to vote.
 - iv. Have been a resident of Vancouver for at least
30 days immediately before you register to
vote (for resident electors)
- OR
- have owned a property in Vancouver for at least
30 days immediately before you register to
vote (for non-resident property electors).
- v. Not have been disqualified by law from voting.

**Landed immigrants who are not yet Canadian citizens are
not permitted to vote.*

4. In late October, all registered voters will receive a **Where to Vote Card** in the mail. It lists your designated voting place. Or you can find your voting place by going to: vancouver.ca/vote. Type your address into the search tool and it will tell you exactly where to vote.
5. To check if you are already registered to vote, call: **604.873.7681**.
6. Eligible voters not already registered to vote, can still vote on Election Day or at an advanced voting opportunity. Just bring two pieces of ID to your designated voting place showing your name, signature and address.
7. Any eligible voter can vote at an advance voting opportunity. These are scheduled for:
November 5, 8, 10 and 12 from 8 am – 8 pm
at the following locations:
City Hall, Dunbar Community Centre, Trout Lake Community Centre, West End Community Centre and Sunset Community Centre.
8. You may be eligible to vote by mail.
Check vancouver.ca/vote for criteria.
9. If you require special assistance and/or translation ask at your voting place.
10. The **Vancouver Voters' Guide** will be delivered to every household in Vancouver in late October; it will also be available at libraries and community centres throughout the city. It includes candidate profiles and detailed information on the election. You can also view a copy of this important booklet at vancouver.ca/vote in late October.
