Special Voting Opportunities

Advance Voting

The City will offer two advance voting opportunities for the Olympic Vote. These will be at City Hall on February 12 and 18, 2003, from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. Advance voters must sign a declaration stating the reason they are unable to vote February 22, 2003.

Here are possible reasons for advance voting:

- you will be absent from the city on February 22
- you are unable to vote on February 22 for reasons of conscience
- you are unable to attend at the voting place on February 22 for reasons beyond your control
- you have a physical disability or a mobility impairment
- you are an election official on February 22.

If you have a physical disability, illness or injury that affects your ability to vote on February 22 (or at the advance polls), the City offers two other voting options:

- mail ballot voting
- special voting at care facilities.

Mail Ballot Voting

Mail ballots will be provided on receipt of a completed Application for Mail Ballot form (these forms are available from the Election Office). Packages containing the mail ballots will be issued after Monday, February 10 and must be returned to the Election Office no later than 8 p.m. on February 22, 2003. With your written permission, someone else can pick up your mail ballot package and return it to the Election Office for you.

Special Voting at Care Facilities

Vancouver care facilities with more than 50 resident-electors will be offered Applications for Mail Ballots. Also, starting February 10, 2003, a special mobile voting team will visit eligible electors who are patients in Vancouver acute care hospitals.
