At the May 30, 2017 Regular Council meeting, Councillor Reimer requested an update on the Procedure By-law review.

City Clerk's Office staff are currently conducting a comprehensive review of the Procedure By-law. City Clerk's Office and Corporate Communications recently completed an Engagement Strategy for the by-law review in which staff will facilitate a public survey and a staff survey. The purpose of the surveys is to better understand public and staff experiences in attending and speaking at Council meetings. The surveys will endeavor to better understand various aspects of speaking to Council including:

- the challenges and barriers to accessing and speaking to Council;
- the opportunities to improve public access and experience when speaking to Council;
- language and accessibility needs of the public; and
- conduct at meetings.

It is anticipated that the survey will be publicized in August and September of 2017, with advertisement in social and traditional media including: Talk Vancouver, Vancouver Matters, and the City Clerk's Office Twitter feed. Once closed, staff will analyse the results of the
