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Re: Request for Access to Records under the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (The "Act")

Further to our email dated July 6, 2017 regarding your request for information with respect to:

Past and current infrastructure investment and bike lanes investment from January 1, 2010 to July 12, 2017, for the following locations:

- 1. Drake Street to Water Street;
- 2. Burrard Street to Howe Street; and
- 3. Granville Bridge/ Burrard Bridge

All responsive records are below.

For parts one and two of your request:

Burrard Street North Project (bike lane, from the bridge to Burnaby Street) 2017: \$ 381,576

Comox Helmcken Bikeway: Traffic Signals Burrard at Comox/Helmcken: \$ 427,352

Hornby Street Bike Lane Paint Markings - lane line removals and application of skid resistant paint - 2011 Cycling Program: \$ 130,414

Hornby Street Separated Bike Lanes Project: signs, paint markings, planters and signal modifications: \$ 3,239,712

For part three of your request:

Burrard Bridge

The **\$28,351,142** expenses include sidewalk, railing, fencing, stair reconstruction, curbing, expansion joint rehabilitation, street lighting upgrades and a major redesign, reconstruction,

traffic signal upgrades at the Burrard/Pacific intersection. A minor expense component is specific bike lane improvements.

Granville Bridge

No bike lane infrastructure on Granville Street Bridge.
