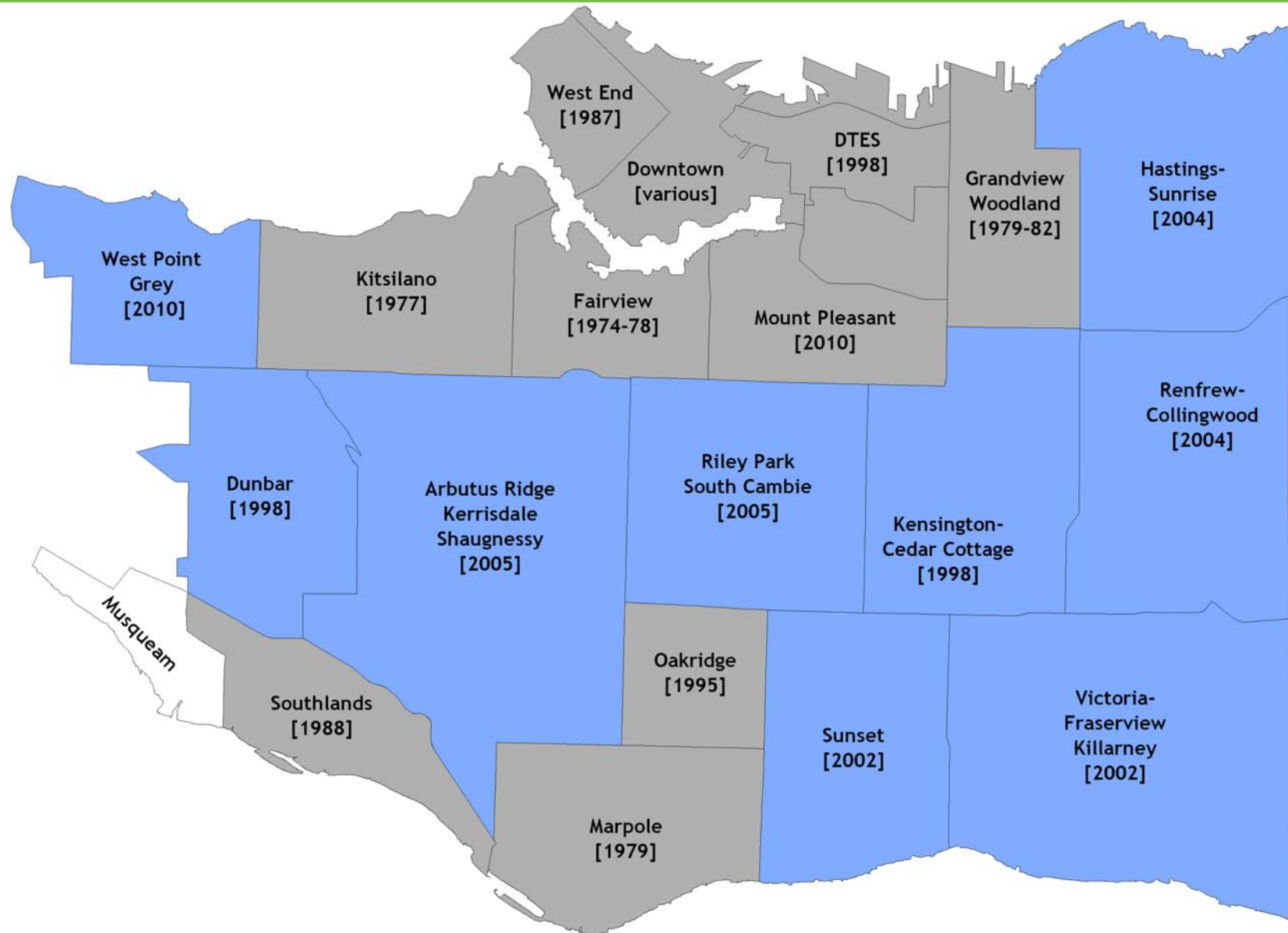
Policy hierarchy

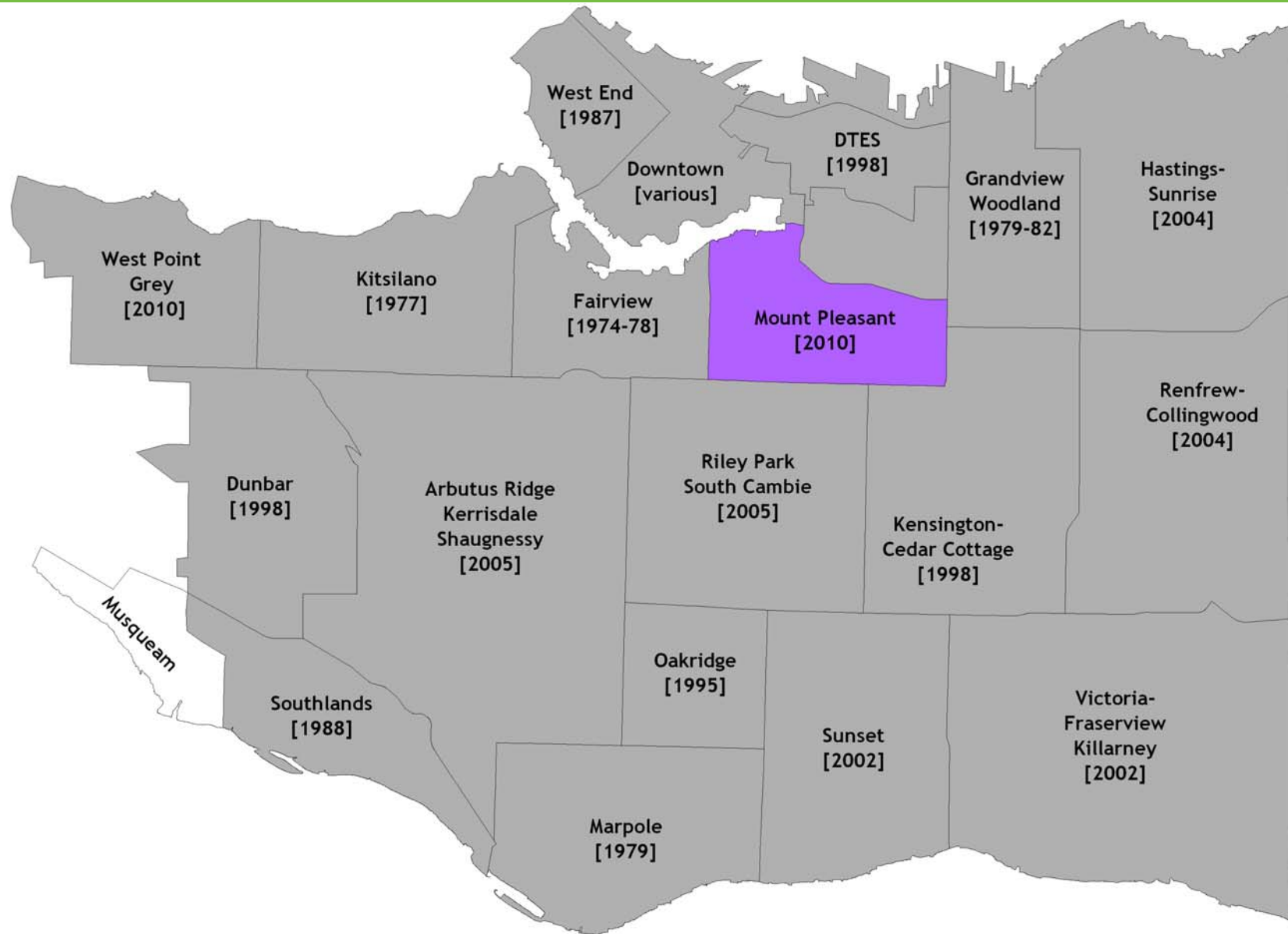


Local Area Plans: 1974-1995

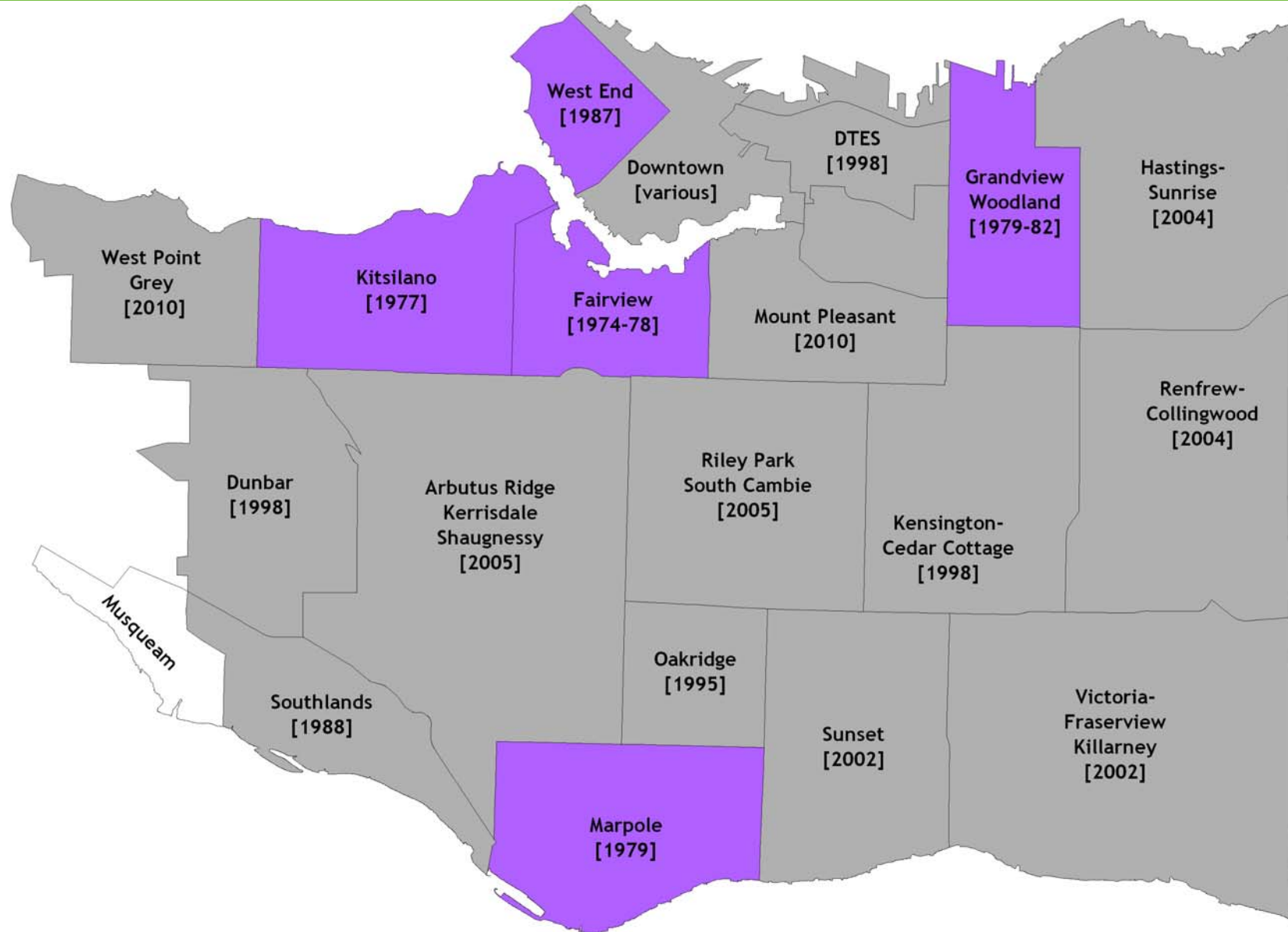


CityPlan, Visions: 1990s-2010


