





AREA 10-B

Immediately west of Granville Bridge, plans call for a unique mix of private residential, public and commercial amenities.

Modelled on a highly successful development in Port Grimaud, France, some 270 homes are planned in three tiers around a waterfront piazza and promenade. All are designed to command a spectacular view of the water, city and mountains.

Adding a new and exciting dimension, three man made harbours are proposed inside the contour of the existing seawall complete with pedestrian walkways and bridges as well as two novel island housing enclaves.

Existing and new streets, promenades and paths are designed to converge on the piazza in series of stepped and converging spirals.


Thus the piazza will form a logical focus for social and community facilities, local shopping, dining and entertainment.

GRANVILLE ISLAND


Strategically located in the middle of False Creek, the \$20 million Granville Island redevelopment program promises to add yet another exciting dimension to life on the south shore.

Once a quaint backwater of old warehouses, factories, and offices, the 37 acre island is destined to become a place for people. Soon the sounds of industry will be muted by the laughter of children, the chatter of sightseers, shoppers and students as they explore a colourful world of open waterfront, theatres, restaurants, museums and work areas for arts and crafts. A college of arts is also planned as well as maritime and farmers' markets and other facilities.


In short, a delightfully different oasis in the heart of the city.




PROPOSED REDEVELOPMENT STRATEGIES FOR GRANVILLE ISLAND




A view of Granville Island, looking north, showing the result of the strategy until 1982, recommended in this report.






- B. The sketch above shows the view which exists in the potential lagoon area.




