Little Mountain Policy Statement Public Benefits

The development of the Little Mountain site will deliver a suite of public benefits to the area. These items were determined through an area wide needs assessment, City Council direction and the Little Mountain planning process.

- A new Little Mountain Neighbourhood House
- A childcare facility
- Additional social housing (Council direction to achieve 20% social housing, including the 224 replacement units)
- Upgrades to Queen Elizabeth Park along Ontario St.
- Local transportation improvements (greenway upgrades, traffic calming, street improvements)



Draft Policy Recommendation

The priority will be to direct Community Amenity Contributions from rezonings in the Adjacent Area to the Affordable Housing Reserve Fund inorder to help achieve the 20% social housing target on the Little Mountain site, or to help deliver other social housing units in the Riley Park South Cambie area.
