

## Ebisu Park Info Session (comments from sticky notes)

- Off-leash dog park
- More outdoor space for young families in the adjacent apartments.
- David Lloyd school could use help with green space money.
- David Lloyd school needs some grass.
- Basically a good idea...but please be aware of where the vehicle traffic is likely to go once a block of 72nd Ave. is closed. As for use of the new park space, just general park to sit on a bench and breathe the air. If it's to be used for dogs please enclose off or strictly on-leash.
- Blocking 72nd Ave and lane to south is a bad idea. It forces traffic onto 73rd which has no east bound thoroughfare, to 71st Ave to access Oak to go East on Marine Drive (71st and Oak is very busy), or forces commuter and residential users on lane.
- Limit car use of lane to emergency vehicles to ensure safety of park users, especially children and seniors.
- Keep access via Osler and 72nd Ave to Oak St. (below and west of bridge) so traffic can still go to Kent St. or SW Marine Dr. This will allow shopping at Canadian Tire and Superstore, especially with Safeway being developed. Keep the traffic lights at Oak St. and SW Marine Dr.
- Please keep it dog friendly!
- This proposed park will create very undesirable traffic problems for a small gain in park space. Is it worth the pain?
- Contained off leash dog park! Grass areas to play ball or picnic
- We already have another park on 72nd Ave. West of this site! Under utilized? Presently. Why? Why don't we enhance it to make it more attractive (e.g. landscaping, children's' play equipment, benches, etc.). Less parking . Have no through route traveling east 72nd Ave. to get onto Arthur Lang Bridge.
- This idea would work better at Marpole Park (72nd and Cartier). This park is new and neat; Marpole Park needs refurbishing!
- The park is fun.
- Diversity! Variety in park landscape. Parkour facilities.
- Community garden.
- If you go ahead with making the 1/2 block of 72nd east of Selkirk a park, then make the other 1/2 block from the laneway to Osler a one-way east bound street.
- There is a park near by called Marpole Park. That also may be able to close some streets.
