
The Pearson Dogwood Neighbourhood will strive to nourish, sustain, heal, restore, regenerate, and enrich:

The 5 Elements were developed based on best practices, evidence-based design, and consultation with stakeholders including Pearson residents, Dogwood residents' families, Marpole residents, therapeutic pool users, health services professionals, Urban Farmers on 57th, representatives from the disabilities community, and others.

ACCESS


The neighbourhood is "turned inside out" through strong connections and destinations within reach by all.

Pearson Dogwood: An Opportunity to Support Both Heathcare Services and the Local Neighbourhood

- Increased Revenue The Pearson Dogwood redevelopmentaimstoincreaserevenueforthe Provincial health care budget by unlocking the highest possible real estate value of this 10 hectare site.
- Rejuvinating Residential Care Housing Through redevelopment, VCH will generate the means to rejuvenate its stock of residential care housing, including the replacement of the George Pearson Centre and Dogwood Lodge.
- Creating Community Benefits Similarly, all of the housing, health and community benefits described in today's open house are dependent on the financial proceeds generated from development. The value of these proceeds is directly linked to the number of market residential units (i.e. density) that the City of Vancouver permits VCH to build.
- From this density comes the financial sustainability of the project and, more broadly, VCH's ability to invest new money into the rejuvenation of residential care throughout the region.






Pearson Dogwood has been identified by the City of Vancouver as having high potential for district energy. District energy will be an important part of the new neighbourhood's ecological health.

(A) CYCLING & TRANSIT NETWORK





LARGE GREEN SPACES




Pearson Dogwood will form part of a larger network of spaces that provide habitat and permeable surfaces that support Vancouver's urban forest.

COMMUNITY HEALTH AREAS




The Pearson Dogwood lands are located in Community Health Area 6, which is the second largest and the largest and most culturally diverse in terms of population.








