

"I always hit it well at the range. How do I get my range game out onto the course?"

This is such a catch 22, because most people use the range differently than they do the golf course. Do you play on the range? Or do you hit balls into the abyss, one after another? Instead of trying to take your range game to the course...flip it, and try taking your course game to the range so you can work on it!

Play at the range - How do you simulate the game of golf at the range?

Use a scorecard for any course. Look at the first hole (400 yards), pick a club. I pick a driver, wack it 240 yards. Towards my target, 20 yards offline, but still in play. 400 - 240 = 160. Take out your 160 club and wack it. I hit it 150 yards 10 yards left of my target. Use your imagination, and guess how far you would be from the pin... I'm guessing on the green 40 feet from the pin... write that on the scorecard. On in two, 40 feet from hole... do this for as many holes as you want. Then go to the putting green and hit the putts you left yourself. Add up your score.
