### auto crime prevention tips

- Lock your vehicle.
- Invest in a good anti-theft device.
- Don't leave anything in your vehicle.
- Look for a well-lit, open area, near pedestrian activity if you're parking outside.
- Never assume your vehicle won't attract a thief.
- Avoid buildup of old insurance decals when applying new ones.
- Be sure to watch the gate close each time you leave or enter secure parking areas.
- Keep an extra key with you, not in the vehicle.
