SUBJECT: 2SLGBTQ+ Advisory Committee Report of Activities, 2021–2022

PURPOSE

To provide Vancouver City Council with a report on the activities of the 2SLGBTQ+ Advisory Committee for the period of May 18, 2021 to November 6, 2022.

BACKGROUND

The 2SLGBTQ+ Advisory Committee was established by Council 2SLGBTQ+ to advise Council and staff on enhancing access and inclusion for two-spirit, lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer communities to fully participate in City services and civic life.

DISCUSSION

The Committee's significant accomplishments and recommendations for future action are discussed in Appendix A, attached.
