THAT The Seniors' Advisory Committee strongly endorses key points articulated in Marc White's presentation to Council regarding the Broadway Plan specifically noting that SAC does not support the Broadway Plan as it currently stands. Specifically SAC would like:

- Greater attention to the creation of social amenities within buildings to support social interaction (e.g. libraries, meeting spaces, hobbies/clubs, resident meetings, etc.);
- Greater support for variances that provide office and program spaces in buildings to support NGO's delivery of programs and services;
- Expansion of Neighbourhood Houses and Seniors' Hubs and Seniors' Centres across neighbourhoods represented in the Broadway Plan; and
- Specific ongoing and long-term affordable housing targets for older adults and elders
  using a diverse social economic intersectionality lens commensurate with renter
  populations with core housing needs.

## Park Board Meeting Highlights:

# Community Centre Strategy:

The Board approved the Vancouver citywide "Community Centre Strategy," which includes recommendations for service targets and prioritization approach to guide community centre renewals in Vancouver. The Board endorsed the Community Centre Renewal List as a means to inform capital planning for recreation facilities and directed staff to initiate scoping and preliminary planning work for Kensington, Renfrew, and Hastings Community Centres for renewal.

The Community Centre Strategy prioritization approach was based on the following criteria:

- #1 Quality Infrastructure
- #2 Equitable and Inclusive Infrastructure for all
- #3 Demonstrated Service Need
- #4 Efficient Use of Land Resources.

The project team applied this approach to the 11 community centres deemed necessary for renewals and developed the following prioritization list:

# **Vancouver Public Library Update**

May 20, 2022 Meeting

Thank you for the opportunity to share information about what's happening at Vancouver Public Library this month.

With the lessening of restrictions by the Public Health Officer, Vancouver Public Library is now following a communicable diseases plan and is continuing to expand in-person programming in a cautious and safe manner. Children's programs continue to be added to the schedule, and some adult programs are being tested as hybrid programs to determine if future programs can be hybrid, in-person, or online. Expansion will continue over the next few months.

<u>Connecting Families</u> is an initiative by the Government of Canada to provide low-cost internet access to eligible families. This program has just been expanded to include seniors who receive the maximum Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS). VPL is able to provide support to seniors who have received an invitation letter for this program to be able to access the \$10 per month internet package.
