SUBJECT: Update on Vancouver Plan Public and Stakeholder Engagement 2021

The purpose of this memorandum is to provide Mayor and Council with a regular update on public engagement activities for Vancouver Plan in order to support ongoing Council participation and leadership.

Following the October 6th Council report "Vancouver Plan Phase 1 Report: Public Engagement Summary, Provisional Goals and Update on COVID-19 Community Recovery Actions" (RTS 13988), staff have been organizing the activities outlined in the report, and are following up on the Council direction in Resolution E:

"THAT Council direct staff to consider ways or forums to enable enhanced involvement and leadership of Council in the Vancouver Plan and city-wide and neighbourhood engagement, on a limited number of issues especially related to "complete communities"...

This memo summarizes upcoming Vancouver Plan engagement and offers options for Council involvement in the weeks ahead.



These engagement activities support the current Phase 2 of planning: Envision the Future and Strategic Directions. Staff intend to report to Council in July on these emerging directions, and on Quick Start Actions to advance the Vancouver Plan. This will be followed by Phase 3 – Choices, Trade-Offs and Draft Strategy in the Fall of 2021.

Summary of Engagement Activities (January – March 2021)

Staff are coordinating a series of broad public and community-level dialogues/ workshops (virtually and consistent with public health protocols) to advance the goals for the Vancouver Plan. Efforts include activities with nine neighbourhood houses, outreach to school-aged children, youth councils and university students, partnership development with Musqueam, Squamish and Tsleil-Waututh Nations and MVAEC, and focused activities with Council Advisory Committees.

The Future We Want: The Change We Need" – On-Line Dialogue Series with SFU (January 21 – March 11, 2021)

We have appreciated ongoing Council participation in our online dialogue series with Simon Fraser University, which launched late last year and continues into March. The dialogues engage local, national and international leaders and thinkers on the future of Vancouver.

The January 21st session: *Towards a More Equitable Housing System: Is Vancouver a City for Renters?* engaged nearly 500 participants in a wide-ranging dialogue on models, approaches and challenges for more equitable housing and rental strategies.

The next session, on **February 17**th: **Closer to Home: The Case for Complete Neighbourhoods (6:30-8:30pm)** will feature a panel of knowledgeable presenters who think about neighbourhoods from different perspectives, exploring questions like:

- When is a neighbourhood "complete," and does a more complete neighbourhood actually benefit residents?
- Can we prevent displacement as we accommodate change?
- What is our best thinking about how to meet diverse needs in our neighbourhoods?
- Does strengthening individual neighbourhoods strengthen the city overall?

- Reimagining a Green and Connected City Between the Buildings our streets, places & spaces – March 4th 6:30 - 8:30pm
- **Reconciliation and Decolonization** time and date to be finalized in collaboration with partners.

We would also like to provide opportunities for members of Council to identify sessions in which they have a specific interest and wish to play an active role, for instance, offering opening remarks or co-moderating with SFU. We anticipate up to two members of Council at each event in these roles.

Community and Neighbourhood Groups Workshops – February 2021

Staff are convening neighbourhood-based organizations – including resident associations, community centre associations, neighbourhood houses and other community leaders – for online dialogues to explore Vancouver Plan provisional goals and big ideas to advance them at the local and city-wide level. This workshop will also discuss how best to engage with local community organizations throughout the planning process.
