Subject: Upcoming NR: Complete Neighbourhoods Engagement (April 19, 2021)

Dear Mayor and Council,

Further to the memo you received outlining a new wave of public engagement opportunities for Complete Neighbourhoods as part of the Vancouver Plan, I am writing to inform you that the City will be issuing a news release on the same topic today, April 19.

Complete Neighbourhood engagement opportunities include:

- A survey on how Vancouver's neighbourhoods could be made more complete for everyone (live now – May 7)
- Neighbourhood mapping workshops to understand how complete individual areas are at present (April 19, 20, 28 and May 1)
- Neighbourhood design workshops to imagine how complete neighbourhoods could look in the future (April 21, 22, 24, 26, 27 and 29)
- Self guided walking tours of Mount Pleasant, Broadway and Arbutus and Grandview /Hastings

Should they be helpful to you, some key messages we will be sharing in the news release include:

- We are reaching out to all residents who live, work and play in Vancouver to explore ways to improve the quality of life and livability of our neighbourhoods.
- Creating complete, connected, and culturally-vibrant neighbourhoods is a key goal of Planning Vancouver Together, a new, city-wide effort to plan for Vancouver's future.
- The goal of the Complete Neighbourhoods is to hear from residents and understand what our neighbourhoods should include to meet their everyday needs.
 - This may include a range of different housing types, a variety of shops and services, recreation and cultural facilities, schools and daycares, pathways, parks or plazas.
- By addressing what's important to residents now, we can plan how to build more complete neighborhoods in the future.
