Here's a summary of Dr. Henry / Minister Dix update for today, 27 April 2020

- BC has reached an unfortunate milestone: over 100 people have died of COVID-19 in BC. (103 total)

Updates since last update on Saturday:

Saturday - Sunday:

- 39 new cases
- Total cases: 1,987

Sunday - Monday:

- 11 additional cases
- Total 1,998

Outbreaks:

Long Term Care Facilities:

- Two additional outbreaks in long term care facilities in the Fraser Health Authority
 - o 1 new case in each of these facilities
 - 0
- 1 long term care facility has ended since the last update; 12 long term care facilities have seen their outbreaks end
- 389 people living in long term care facilities still have COVID-19

Community Outbreaks:

- Superior Poultry: 25 positive cases
- United Poultry: 34 positive cases

Mission Correctional Facility:

- 118 cases
 - o 106 inmates
 - o 12 staff

Kearl Lake, Alta Outbreak:

- 11 individuals have tested positive in association with this outbreak
- Several hundred people in BC are associated with this workplace

Hospitalizations:

97 people in hospital in BC
0 36 in ICU

Deaths:

- 3 additional deaths in the last three days
- 103 total deaths in BC

Recovered:

- 11,090 people have now fully recovered

Easing of Restrictions:

- Looking to create a Made in BC Plan to ease restrictions
- Making plans to ease restrictions with the understanding of what we may face in doing so. BC is taking time to do it correctly to ensure no resurgence in cases
- Working on a framework that everyone can follow

Misc:

- We are now seeing a decline in COVID-19 numbers in BC
- 4,159 vacant hospital beds available

Q & A:

Q: Return to school date and will PPEs be required in schools?

A: Working with the BC Ministry of Education to plan / don to vet have a date in mind. Priority will be for younger children who can to alone alone once their parents return to work

A: Though masks are not culturally common in BC, masks may be considered in those situations where physical distancing isn possible.

Q: Should we be worried about further community transmission due to workers travelling via transit to poultry factories that have had outbreaks?

A: Probably not, as we took preventative measures in public transit.
