**Subject:** Upcoming IB: City seeks feedback on Rain Friendly Pop-Up Plazas

Dear Mayor and Council,

I am writing to inform you that the City will be issuing an information bulletin today, April 30, seeking public feedback on Rain Friendly Pop-Up Plazas.

A few key points include:

- The public is reminded to share their feedback on rain friendly plazas through a short online survey until May 7<sup>th</sup>.
- The rain friendly plazas are located at:
  - Cambie Bridge South at False Creek Neighbourhood Energy Utility (1890 Spyglass Place)
  - Cambie Bridge South at W 1st Ave (on the multi-use path)
  - Cambie Bridge North (north of Cooper Park)
  - Burrard Bridge North (south of the Seawall)
- Rain friendly pop-up plazas have been a quick, cheerful and inexpensive way for City staff to trial weather-protected plazas.
- The four plazas were first installed this past December as part of our COVID-19, Making Streets for People program, and have helped to create more space for physical distancing, community life and local businesses recovery efforts.
