- 53 new cases
 - Total cases in BC: 2,224

- 23 active outbreaks in long term care facilities
 - No new outbreaks today
 - $\,\circ\,$ 13 new cases in long term care facilities

Community Outbreaks

- 3 in poultry processing plants
 - o 54 at Superior Poultry
 - o 35 at United Poultry
 - o 17 at a poultry processing plant in the Fraser Valley
- Mission Correctional Facility
 - 134 total cases
 - ⊙121 inmates
 - ⊙13 staff
- Kerl Lake, Alta Plant
 - \odot 15 cases directly related to the plant
 - o Additional cases in family members of returning workers

Hospitalizations

- 77 currently in hospital
 - o 20 in ICU

Deaths

- 3 additional deaths in long term care facilities
- 112 total deaths in BC

Recoveries

1,417 fully recovered

Epidemiology Studies:

- Most cases: 30 260 year olds
 - $\circ\,$ More women than men have been infected
- Percentage of hospitalizations:
 - Higher for older population (70 -90s). More men than women contract acute disease that requires hospitalization
- ICU admittance:
 - Older age groups (60s+)
 - $\circ\,$ More men than women admitted to ICU
 - $_{\odot}\,$ But do see some people in their 20s and 30s admitted as well
- Deaths:
 - Most seen in older age groups (70s, 80s, 90s)
 - Half of men over the age of 90 die, while less than 20% of women older than 90 die (reasons unknown)
 - \circ 14.1% of those admitted to ICU die
