Subject: Upcoming NR - Ride Hailing Inter-Municipal Business Licence

Greetings Mayor and Council,

The City of Vancouver has issued the first inter-municipal business licence for ride-hailing to a company called Kabu. This licence allows Kabu to pick up and drop off passengers across the Lower Mainland using one business licence.

Participating municipalities include: Abbotsford, Anmore, Bowen Island, Burnaby, Chilliwack, Coquitlam, Delta, Harrison Hot Springs, City of Langley, Township of Langley, Lions Bay, Maple Ridge, District of North Vancouver, Pitt Meadows, Port Coquitlam, Port Moody, Richmond, Squamish, Surrey, Vancouver, West Vancouver, White Rock.

The City's municipal ride-hailing regulations will remain in place for Lyft and Uber, until they apply for their inter-municipal licence. Kabu was the only other business that had received a municipal ride-hailing business licence to operate in the City of Vancouver.
