Subject:	Temporary patios - update

Good afternoon Mayor and Council,

On behalf of Jessie and Margaret, I am writing to provide a brief update on the temporary expedited patio program as well as progress to enable patios for breweries.

Temporary Expedited Patio Program

- Since the launch of the program on Monday June 1, we have a received a total of 32 patio applications. Of those, 24 are located on public property and can be considered for the temporary expedited patio program.
 - The majority of these applications are situated in the curb lane, with the remaining are proposed to be on the building frontage.
 - Four patio approvals were issued Tuesday, June 2, based on applications received on Monday, June 1. An additional 6-8 patios approvals are anticipated to be issued today.
 - To date staff have met or exceeded the service level target to approve qualifying applications within two business days.
 - Staff are working with applicants to amend and update applications in cases where minimum requirements have not been met (e.g. in order to retain minimum area for pedestrian movement).
- □ Staff have received 8 enquiries for patios on private property which are being reviewed and are helping to advance development of the expedited patio program on private property.

Update on Enabling Patios for Breweries

- Work continues to enable patios in more complex contexts, for example on private land and for breweries without a restaurant clearance.
- Staff have determined that temporary patios can be enabled on *public right of way*, even if the brewery does not have a restaurant clearance under current zoning. This will enable an expedited patio for a number of breweries who have expressed interest.
- □ Staff are continuing to develop options for breweries lacking a restaurant clearance who wish to install a patio on private land and will continue to update Council as that work progresses.
