Western Canada COVID-19 Citizen Research

The City of Vancouver through Civic Engagement and Communications recently participated in a Western Canada COVID-19 Citizen Research study that assessed citizen experiences and attitudes around COVID-19 and perceptions of municipal government. This research included the metropolitan areas of Vancouver (including City of Vancouver proper), Calgary, Edmonton and Winnipeg.

Residents were asked about: perceptions of the City and its actions during COVID-19, personal impacts of the pandemic, their outlook for the near future and thoughts on reopening, including levels of comfort and preferred precautions to prevent spread.

Some highlights from the City of Vancouver results:

- 78% are satisfied with the City's COVID-19 response, and 71% satisfied with the relaunch plans
- 43% say they have experienced job or income loss as a result of the pandemic
- 27% are worried about re-opening too soon and needing to shut down again, but 68% trust the City to make the right choices about re-opening services
- As services and amenities re-open people are most comfortable taking part in outdoor activities (e.g. 86% comfortable using parks and pathways) and least comfortable with indoor activities (e.g. 17% using an indoor public pool)

COV COVID-19 Pulse Survey

Over the summer the circumstances surrounding COVID-19 will continue to evolve as the City implements the stages of its Restart Plan and the Province makes announcements related to re-opening. We expect that public attitudes and actions related to COVID-19, comfort with re-opened activities and sentiment about the City will change over time.

So, to provide an opportunity for tracking changes in attitudes over time, expand the Western Canadian research to more Vancouver citizens, and to ask more detailed questions, we'll be launching the **COVID-19 Pulse Survey** through the Talk Vancouver platform the week of June 29th. The survey will be open to members of Talk Vancouver and the general public, and promoted through multiple channels. The target is to launch the survey every 3 weeks thereafter.

The COVID-19 Pulse Survey will ask the public about perceptions of the City, impacts of the pandemic, and thoughts on the future and re-opening. In addition to the tracking feature, we'll be able to tailor questions unique to the City of Vancouver and deep-dive, examining the "why" behind the attitudes reported.

METHODOLOGY

Data collection was conducted June 11-17, 2020 via an online survey using Computer Assisted Web Interviewing (CAWI) technology. The sample was randomly recruited from Leger's LEO online research panel. The questions were jointly developed by the City research teams in Calgary, Edmonton, Vancouver and Winnipeg. The same questions were used in all locations. This report shows comparisons between the City of Vancouver and the aggregate (NET) results for all four cities, as well as comparisons between the City of Vancouver, the other municipalities within Metro Vancouver, and Metro Vancouver as a whole.

No margin of error can be associated with a non-probability sample (web panel in this case). Please note, however, the following for comparative purposes:

- Calgary (n=500; margin of error (MOE) for a probability sample would be ±4.4%, 19 times out of 20)
- Edmonton (n=500; MOE ±4.4%, 19 times out of 20)
- Winnipeg (n=400; MOE ±4.9%, 19 times out of 20)
- Metro Vancouver (*n*=500; MOE ±4.4%, 19 times out of 20)
 Total Sample: *n*=1,900 (MOE ±2.3%, 19 times out of 20)

Statistics Canada estimates were used to generate a demographically representative sample by gender and age for those 18 years or older. This was applied individually for each of the four cities.



SAMPLE

- 1. City of Vancouver residents (n=171).
- 2. Metro Vancouver Other residents, which include residents within the Vancouver Census Metropolitan Area (CMA) and excludes those who live within the City of Vancouver (n=329).
- Metro Vancouver Total, which includes residents from within the City of Vancouver and the other municipalities within the Vancouver CMA (n=500).
- The NET scores amongst all four cities Total sample for the four city study encompassing residents of the Calgary, Edmonton, Winnipeg, and Vancouver CMAs (n=1,900).



















































Significant differences between residents in other Metro Vancouver municipalities and City of Vancouver residents:

- Residents living in Other Metro Vancouver are more likely to *never* wear a face mask (16%) than those living within the city (9%)
- Residents living within the city are more likely to usually wear a face mask (32%) than those living in Other Metro Vancouver.

Residents living within the City of Vancouver are significantly more likely to at least sometimes use a face mask (90%) than residents of all four cities combined.

Vancouverites aged 55+ are more likely to indicate always wearing a mask (40%). Those aged 45-54 are more likely to indicate never wearing a mask (24%).






