Hi Mayor and Council

I am writing in response to a councillor question (see below).

In the budget Outlook for 2021, our estimates for 2021 assume all revenues are back to pre-covid levels. We would be restoring all services (to the extent they can be - in some cases there may be limitations due to physical distancing etc) and staff would be recalled from lay-off.

In a 5% scenario the first priority is still to restore services and bring people back from lay-off. We would then look to fill outstanding vacancies where possible.

There is a risk that revenues do not come back to normal levels or there is a 2nd wave. We may need to revisit cost reductions which could mean service impacts and layoffs. We have not modelled that in the outlook - it is a risk we are tracking.
