Dear Mayor and Council,

I am writing to inform you that the City will be issuing an information bulletin on July 14 regarding the launch of the Budget 2022 engagement process. In addition we'll be promoting the engagement opportunities on social media, and we would appreciate if you could re-share the City's social messages with your networks to help promote participation.

Should they be helpful to you, some key messages we will be sharing in the bulletin include:

- Those who live, or own or operate a business in Vancouver, are invited to share their thoughts on City spending priorities for the 2022 Budget
- Engagement launches on July 14 with a short online survey, which is open until August 22
- Information on the budget process and engagement opportunities are available in six languages at <https://shapeyourcity.ca/budget>
- There will be further opportunities to provide feedback as part of the presentation of the Draft Budget to Council in the fall
- In April, City Council voted to set a target limit on the property tax rate increase for 2022 to no more than five per cent
