Dear Mayor and Council,

The annual Pride Parade is fast approaching and here is important information about the City's entry in the parade and how you can participate on Sunday, July 31st!

This year's Pride Parade theme is *Together Again*, celebrating the beauty that comes in reuniting and uplifting 2SLGBTQ+ communities [and all of us]! Mayor and Council will be joined by Vancouver Fire and Rescue Services, and staff from across City departments.

We will have two City energy efficient vehicles in the parade, including a hybrid Silverado pick-up truck with a DJ in the back driven by Lon LaClarie, City Engineer, and an electric Mitsubishi SUV driven by Engineering staff. There is limited seating in these vehicles for those who have mobility limitations.

## Where and When to meet on Sunday July 31

- The staging area is on Robson Street, between Thurlow and Bute (see maps below). Our exact location this year is BN1 located on the North side of Robson Street just East of Bute Street.
- All marchers are to arrive at 11:30am, fencing is closed off soon afterwards, making it difficult to access the marchers. The parade begins at NOON sharp!
- The parade route is approximately 3 km and takes about an hour to complete barring any stoppages.
- Parade participants especially those with mobility issues must be aware that seating is limited in the two energy
  efficient vehicles.
- We will have buttons to give away. Buttons must be handed out, never thrown into the crowd.
- The Parade disperses on Pacific for Vehicle traffic and on Beach Avenue for marchers.




