Subject: Upcoming NR - New Piece of Public Art in Chinatown

Dear Mayor and Council,

On August 26, a new piece of public art will be installed in Chinatown to highlight Chinese Canadian cultural heritage. The neon artwork piece by Paul Wong displays the Chinese characters 鹹水埗哥 华, which translates as 3Saltwater City Vancouver3 commemorates Wong3 early memories of the neighbourhood. The piece was commissioned by the City as part of Wong's year-long Occupying Chinatown residency and it will be placed on the site of the old City Hall near the Carnegie Community Centre.

The City will issue a news release in both English and Simplified Chinese on August 27 to publicize the installation.
