Jericho Lands planning program presents conceptual site plan options for public feedback

The Jericho Lands planning program is moving into its latest phase of engagement with the presentation of conceptual site plan options, which outline how the future redevelopment of the site might look.

The City of Vancouver is working with the joint venture partnership of the xwməθkwəyəm (Musqueam), Skwxwú7mesh (Squamish), and səlílwəta? (Tsleil-Waututh) Partnership and Canada Lands Company (CLC), the owners of the Jericho Lands, on directions for the future of the site. The Jericho Lands are a 36-hectare (90 acre) site in Vancouver's West Point Grey neighbourhood, bounded by West 4th Avenue, Highbury Street, West 8th Avenue, and West Point Grey Park.

The conceptual site plans show versions of how the site could be organized in terms of parks and public spaces, streets and pathways, retail areas and community gathering space. The options were drafted in collaboration with the landowners' design team after the first two phases of engagement, taking into account feedback from the community, MST Nation members and stakeholder groups, as well as existing City policies.

Your feedback, along with input from various stakeholders and technical analysis, will be used to select a preferred site concept that will be refined and presented for more public input during the next phase of engagement.

The Jericho Lands planning program will create a Policy Statement which will provide direction for the site's future on: reconciliation, transportation and connections, parks and open space, housing mix including affordable housing, land use, building height and density, sustainability, and public benefits to support the new community.

The Jericho Lands Policy Statement will also integrate with the Vancouver Plan https://vancouverplan.ca/, a strategic citywide, long-range plan that will guide our city to 2050 and beyond.

Since launching the Jericho Lands planning program in 2019, City staff have co-hosted a variety of public engagement events with the MST Partnership and CLC, providing a range of opportunities for people to share their thoughts and help shape the future of the Jericho Lands.
