The purpose of this memo is to provide an update on fall engagement activities for the Vancouver Plan and highlight opportunities for Council participation.

The fall engagement is a key opportunity for the community to help create a bold plan for a livable, affordable and sustainable future. An array of engagement activities have been created and will begin on October 25 continuing through November 25. Key objectives of this effort are to:

- 1. Share emerging directions for the Vancouver Plan, including three Big ideas on:
 - Equitable Housing and Complete Neighbourhoods
 - · An Economy that Works for All
 - Climate Action and Restored Ecosystems
- Gauge community interest and support for growth that aligns with our values of livability, affordability and sustainability
- 3. Explore three main areas of change and how we can plan for growth in neighbourhoods by evaluating the benefits and disadvantages of different approaches.



This month-long community engagement features:

- On-line webinars, workshops, surveys and educational materials including discussion guides, hand-outs, presentations and videos. Target audiences are the broader community, diverse stakeholder groups, and youth.
- In-person open houses at City Lab, pop-up tents, and tri-pillar displays with information at locations throughout the city.
- A "Council of Council Advisory Committees" Forum.
- A Public Dialogue and a Special Meeting of Council involving a City-Builder Panel Discussion.

Information is available on the Vancouver Plan website at: https://vancouverplan.ca/ in over 100 languages through the google translate tool, and is being promoted in ten languages through the City's social media channels. A schedule of events is attached with further updates for stakeholder sessions to be confirmed. Some highlights for Council's interest include the following:

Phase 3 Engagement Launch: (Oct 27, 9:00 am) - In Person Event

City Lab (511 West Broadway) will host a launch of the Vancouver Plan Phase 3 engagement with a kick-off by senior staff and an opportunity for the media to check out displays and ask questions at 9:00 am. Refreshments will be provided and the public is invited to drop in beginning at 9:30 am.

Open House at City Lab (Oct 26 – Nov 25) - In Person Event

During this month long period, members of the public are invited to drop into City Lab during regularly scheduled times to view display boards, connect with staff, read discussion guides, hand-outs and fill out the Talk Vancouver survey.

Open House Hours

- Oct 26 Oct 30 (9 am 6pm)
- Nov 1 Nov 25 (9 am 6pm on Thurs, Fri, Sat, Mon each week)

Neighbourhood Area Workshops (Oct 26 - Nov 15) - Virtual Events

Twelve virtual workshops will be held in six broad neighbourhood areas throughout the city. These workshops will be an opportunity for participants to learn about early directions for the Vancouver Plan and to roll up their sleeves in break-out groups to consider how the Three Big Ideas may be realized in areas of future change (e.g. rapid transit areas, neighbourhood shopping areas/ centres, low density residential areas). Key themes such as Complete Connected Neighbourhoods, Missing Middle housing and others will be explored in these workshops (see attached schedule for dates).

Pop-up Tent Outreach (Oct 26 – Nov 18) – In Person Events

A pop-up tent display with information on early directions along with hand-outs and a "quick stop" survey will be set up at approximately a dozen locations around the city including transit stations, Carnegie Centre, Vancouver Public Library Central Branch, Neighbourhood Houses, Trout Lake Farmers Market, and many other locations.

Council of Council Advisory Committees Forum (Nov 10, 6:00 - 8:00 pm) – Virtual Event
The City is fortunate to have a full spectrum of appointed advisory committees and
commissions, comprised of hundreds of volunteer representatives. The Council of Advisory
Committees is a forum that brings representatives of all the advisory committees together to
advise on key City initiatives. It has previously engaged to provide input on the Vancouver Plan
during the launch and during Phase 1. This virtual forum will involve a presentation by staff on

the emerging directions for the Vancouver Plan followed by facilitated break-out discussions where committee members can provide feedback on how to realize the three Big Ideas in specific areas of future growth and change. As with previous Council of Advisory Committee forums, City Council is invited to attend, listen and participate. The event will be video taped and made available on-line to the public with documented report outs from discussion groups.

City-Builders Panel Dialogues (Nov 23, times listed below) - Virtual Events

Two successive virtual dialogue sessions with a panel of international thought leaders in City Building are being planned to give diverse perspectives on emerging directions for the Vancouver Plan and to share leading examples, ideas and lessons learned. The first dialogue is an opportunity for broad public engagement where Council is invited to listen; while the second event is an opportunity for Council to engage directly with the City Builder Panel in a smaller dialogue to reflect on the public conversation and gain further advice on city building for the Vancouver Plan. The two dialogue sessions are as follows:

- Public Dialogue City Building and the Vancouver Plan (Nov 23, 9:00 -11:00 am)
 - A facilitated virtual public dialogue featuring presentations by City Builder Panelists followed by a moderated dialogue with key questions emerging from the public dialogue on Phase 3 of the Vancouver Plan as well as questions submitted by members of the public on-line during the dialogue (facilitated through the chat, poll tools)
- Special Council Meeting: Reflections on City Building and the Vancouver Plan (Nov 23, 3:00 – 5:00 pm)
 - City Builder Panelists from the previous session will provide short presentations to Council members followed by a facilitated round table dialogue between Council members and the panelists to reflect on the morning's public dialogue, ask questions and gain feedback on emerging directions for the Vancouver Plan.
 This is a non-decision-making meeting per the previous panel discussion.

Staff are currently reaching out to a broad diversity of local and international leaders in City-Building in areas of urban design, planning and community development in order to confirm speakers for this panel.

Council's feedback and learnings from the first panel discussion in September on *Vancouver* 2050 – *Growth and Planning* have provided valuable insight and direction in the design of this event. This includes greater opportunity for both public engagement and for meaningful Council dialogue with panelists. Staff will update Council and the public as speakers and details on these dialogues are confirmed.

Youth and Stakeholder Workshops (Oct 26 – Nov 25) - Virtual and In Person Events An extensive series of youth and stakeholder workshops will occur throughout the fall consultations with on-line, self facilitated, and staff-led workshops. The Young Planners program and educational portal of interactive materials will continue to be highly active.

Vancouver Plan engagement is being promoted through the city-wide postcard delivered to 325,000 home owners, renters and businesses, bus and bus shelter advertising, social media, e-newsletters, VPL and Community Centre locations, and more. Participant sign up to events commenced the week of September 27 and has been building steadily. An outreach toolkit with social content has been provided to all Council members.

Feedback from all of these events and more will inform development of a draft Vancouver Plan for public consultation in spring 2022.
