What is included in the sector?

This sector includes a broad range of for-profit and not-for-profit sub-sectors including:

- Professional, social, religious, advocacy and other membership based organizations
- Miscellaneous services such as personal care, laundry, and auto repair

HIGHLIGHTS:

- Other services (except public administration) make up 5% of the city's total employment.
- The sector is the city's 8th largest employer with 18,405 jobs.
- Personal care services and professional associations make up 25% and 14% of the sector's jobs respectively.
- Between 2001 and 2016, the number of jobs in this sector in the city grew by 2,230 jobs (14%).
- Roughly 63% of the city's workers in the sector reside in the city of Vancouver.
- Jobs in the other services sector are distributed across the city.

Job growth in the sector: Vancouver vs. the region

The majority of sector jobs (65%) in the region are located outside the city of Vancouver. The sector is growing, in both the city and region; between 2001 and 2016 the total number of sector jobs in the city increased by 14%. During this same timeframe, the city as a whole added roughly 64,355 jobs, growing by 21%



FIGURE 1. DISTRIBUTION OF SECTOR JOBS IN THE CITY


