Dear Mayor and Council,

This memo provides an update on the implementation of Vancouver's public bike share (PBS) system. There are a number of important milestones planned as part of the roll-out of PBS in Vancouver.

Since entering into the PBS agreement in February 2016, staff have been regularly engaging Vancouver Bike Share Inc. (VBS) to support a successful implementation of public bike share in Vancouver this summer.

The public was first engaged by VBS in early April 2016 when VBS launched their vancouverbikeshare.ca web page, which provided information on the PBS and solicited suggestions for bike share station locations. Over the course of two months more than 7,000 responses for more than 1,300 locations within the initial service area were received. VBS is continuing to consult with residents and businesses adjacent to proposed station locations.

The system name/brand Mobi (pronounced moe-bee), which stands for 'more bikes', was announced in May in conjunction with discounted founding membership sales. A separate web page was also launched to allow for online membership sales. Founding members have first

access to the bikes, and the annual membership rate is significantly reduced for the first year of service. Additional founding member perks include a key fob to access the bikes, a coupon towards the purchase of a helmet from local bike shops, and an invitation to a founding member celebration event.

Bicycles and station equipment have arrived in Vancouver and are continuing to be assembled and decaled with the Mobi brand at VBS's staging yard. Residents and visitors continue to have opportunities to view the bikes, ask questions, and sign up as founding members at local events including the HUB Bike to Work Week wrap-up celebration, and Car Free Days.

In the coming weeks you will begin to see Mobi equipment rolled out in the City. Several key dates are noted below:

Week of June 20

Demonstration stations will be installed in Southeast False Creek. These stations will heighten awareness of the system, provide an opportunity for the public to learn about Mobi, and encourage residents and visitors to sign up as founding members.

Week of June 27

The new Mobi-branded website will launch, to include a map identifying bike share station locations. A founding member preview period beginning with roughly 200 bikes at 20 stations will commence, connecting major cycling and transit routes in a portion of Downtown and around False Creek. A coordinated media announcement will update the public on the launch plans.

Week of July 4

Additional bikes will be added and new stations will be installed to increase the density and geographical area of the system. These additional bikes and stations will be available exclusively to founding members.

Week of July 11

A major media announcement and event will be planned for this week. Following this announcement, the system will be available to all members of the public through regular and founding memberships, and casual day passes. Additional bikes will be added and new stations will continue to be installed to increase the density and geographical area of the system.

• Week of July 18 and continuing through to the end of Summer The system will continue to be expanded throughout the summer, resulting in a total of 1,500 bikes at 150 stations.
