Dear Mayor and Council,

This memorandum provides Mayor and Council with updates and additional information that have arisen between the time of final preparation of the Policy Report dated July 18, 2016, entitled "Grandview-Woodland Community Plan" and Council's consideration of the matter.

DISCUSSION

1. Update on Community Consultation

The Policy Report dated July 18, 2016 and entitled "Grandview-Woodland Community Plan" included in its Appendix B a summary of the feedback from the community up to the time of writing of the report. Feedback forms continued to be received until the stated close of receipt of comments on July 22, 2016.

In total, 634 feedback forms were received from the community at-large. This represents 190 additional forms subsequent to what was reported in the July 18, 2016 Policy Report.



Appended to this memorandum is a complete tabulation of the results for the six questions asked, including the figures that were presented in the Policy Report as well as the final results.

Upon review of the overall results, no substantive changes in the community's overall perspective of the proposed Grandview-Woodland Community Plan is evident. Overall, there is a strong measure of positive community support for the plan. For example, on the question of whether the proposed plan strikes a balance between the specific interests and issues of Grandview-Woodland and broader city-wide goals and aspirations, two out of every three respondents are in support.

Summary of Comments from community feedback on the plan

Feedback forms from the various consultation activities subsequent to the June 25, 2016 public release of the Grandview-Woodland Community Plan were collected and analyzed. This included forms completed at events as well as online through the city's website.

Up to the time of writing of the staff report, 444 feedback forms had been received and the results to that point were summarized in the staff report dated July 18, 2016. By the end of the day on July 22, 2016, a total of 634 feedback forms had been received. Summary results for each question for both the interim and the final results (final totals are shown in italics) are as follows:

2. Additional Input on Matters Important to the Aboriginal Communities

Subsequent to the preparation of the Policy Report, staff have continue to liaise with local Aboriginal non-profits and have received additional comment on the proposed community plan. Opportunities have been highlighted to strengthen language around the role of Aboriginal communities within the plan. Examples include the desire to incorporate expanded references to reconciliation, demographics and cultural traditions. Staff are reviewing the proposed language and can provide a recommendation on how best to reflect it in the Plan, should Council wish to take this direction.
