- You acknowledge by signing this letter that, in performing the Services, you may acquire information about certain matters which are confidential and that such information is the exclusive property of the City and you agree not to disclose same to any third party either during or after the Term.

- Some large corporations said it's hard to find worker of specific skills due to high housing costs ie. Communication Manager of iQmetrix- a Canadian on- line trading company, moved to Saskatchewan due to high housing costs; would stay in Vancouver if single, but once started a family, can't afford to stay anymore
- Government statistics has shown that the age group between 25 44 moving out of Vancouver in the past three years, is more than the same age group moving to Vancouver.
- Business Council of BC's Chief Economist: high housing costs is already a concern for many, and the financial challenge that the younger generation face when raising a family is getting bigger and bigger.
- Also, many local companies find it increasingly difficult to hire special skilled workers to come to Vancouver, especially high management level. They find it unimaginable to move into apartments with only two rooms if they used to live in a single home

- Realtor Oleg Galyuk used Greater Vancouver Realtors Board's statistics and listed out three areas with highest rate of increase in the past 12 months, South Cambie's single home ranks no. 1, with 25.4% increase, to \$230K.
- A Chinese realtor said, Vancouver is still the most popular location for the particular group of affluent Chinese investors. The low interest rate makes it even more attractive to invest in real estate. Once a house on the west side is on sale, it will be gone very quickly, even without viewing, negotiation and adding any conditions. Some new trend of buying the land as well.
- The others are Mackenzie Heights (19.8%, \$240K) and Fraser (17.3%, \$95.5K). Average rate of increase in single home is 11.2%
- South Cambie: housing price increased due to Canadian line station. In general Chinese residents don't worry about the noise and safety concern around Canadian line, but like the walking distance to the train station, and the convenience to future shopping malls close by.

- Since Robertson separated with his wife, many started to pay attention to his personal life. According to Globe & Mail's report, a reliable source said that the 50-year-old Robertson has been dating the 31-year-old Pop star Qu
- Qu immigrated from Mainland China when she was 10, studied shortly at SFU, started to sign contract as a pop star singer since 2009, was delegated as Vancouver's first Tourism Ambassador in 2013, and have accompanied Robertson to visit China in Nov 2013
- Mayor's office: would not respond anything about Mayor's personal life

**2. AM1320 Talk Show: Fare Evasions and TransLink Referendum

Callers:

- Instead of raising 0.5% of PST, increase it to 2% for public transit for everyone. Can also encourage more to take public transit. Questioned by Commentator: feasible option, 2% means \$100,000 increase per year, but need to ensure enough buses and sky train capacity
- Doubt why TransLink has already delayed 3 years to install the fare gate when many countries ie. Asia have done this for more than a decade. Can hire professionals oversees and find out the problem efficiently.
- Transit police is too expensive (\$31M per year) and they are seen as too laidback and not enforcing effectively
- Almost 100% of callers expressed that they are upset with the inefficiencies and lack of transparency, but they never change. Fare increase endlessly. Will vote "No" for sure.
- Would like to talk to TransLink or Province's Ministry of Transportation
- 0.5% PST is a tax above a tax. Already paid tax to TransLink through property tax, gas tax. Infrastructure improvement should be paid by the province, not TransLink.
- <u>TransLink should be dissolved and replaced by a transportation board under</u> <u>the Province</u>

Commentator/ Host:

- Seniors' and disability's bus pass (\$45) can be expanded to people who receive welfare, and include photo in the pass to avoid people from selling it for money. A regular monthly pass (about \$175) is not affordable for welfare recipient (\$425 per month). This may lure some of them to ticket evasions
- Even if taxpayers pay 0.5% PST more, doesn't mean that TransLink can solve the current problems
- TransLink has 6 boards, \$760,000 used in board meetings last year. Lots of inefficiencies

• Fare evasions and referendum are two separate issues. Think the referendum will still pass with strong support from businesses, unions and environmental groups.

- The figure is only for buses, hasn't included other forms of public transit (Skytrain, West Coast Express, Sea Bus and Blue Bus).
- This may already be underestimated as many bus drivers said their supervisors don't care about this and they become less motivated to press the button
- Canadian Taxpayers' Federation: TransLink ignored the problem and causing losses for taxpayers who are honest, asking voters to vote "no" at the referendum
- The Federation obtain the statistic through Act of Freedom of Information. In 2013, bus drivers pressed the "Fare Not Paid Button" to record no. of fare evasions
- 2011- 2.5M times of fare evasions
- Fare gate is \$25M over budget and delayed 3 years
- If TransLink can't effectively manage the current system, voters shouldn't give them extra \$7.5B. TransLink's lack of ability in preventing ticket evasions, enacting compass cards and installing fare gates, all of these gave voters stronger reasons to vote "no" at referendum

**1. (AM1470 Phone-In Show) : Does the Universal Changing Policy At Templeton Swimming Pool Help the Transgender to Blend in, or, Emphasize the Difference? Host/ Commentator:

- the transgender swimming group has already been renting the pool in the past 4 years, but Park Board initiated to open this period to public with universal changing room. But is it necessary and good both for transgender and the public? Without such sign, transgender are welcome anyways.
- Purpose of the policy unclear, or simply public relations work. For transgender who completed the sex reassignment surgery, or, those who haven't? Such policy may lead to more discomfort to transgender, and they may want more

privacy ie. Surgery marks may be visible in a swimming suit. No reply from Park Board

- Question if this is fair to the general public as their concerns are not considered. Inclusiveness is a long term education process but should not bring in a policy
- (2012) 5% claimed to be homosexual, bisexual or transgender. So only less than 1-2% of the population are transgender. Is such policy fair to the majority and necessary?
- Would this be extended to schools and other public amenities eventually?

Callers:

- <u>Purely a political tactic. Definition of transgender is not clear. If completed the</u> <u>surgery, transgender can already freely chose men's or women's washrooms</u>
