- The Act allows the employer to set this four-hour voting period. We have chosen to close City Hall, the West Annex and the Crossroads buildings at 4:00 pm on Tuesday, May 9, 2017, to allow employees whose hours of work are between 8:00 am and 8:00 pm to vote at the end of the day.
- Employees will not lose pay for leaving to vote before the end of their shift if it is within the four hour period, and Managers must approve schedules and provide appropriate coverage.
- Corporate Communications will send out a news release to inform the media and the public of this one-time change in operating hours, and signage will be posted at door entrances.

Dear Mayor and Council,

The *Elections Act RSBC* [1996] Chapter 106 requires an employer to ensure that an employee who is entitled to vote in an election or who, on registration, will be entitled to vote in the election is entitled to have four consecutive hours free from employment during voting hours for general voting.

The Act allows the employer to set this four-hour voting period. We have chosen to close City Hall, the West Annex and the Crossroads buildings at 4:00 pm on Tuesday, May 9, 2017, to allow employees whose hours of work are between 8:00 am and 8:00 pm to vote at the end of the day. In departments where it is not operationally possible to close at 4:00 pm, or where shift arrangements are in place, please ensure that employees have four consecutive hours free between 8:00 am and 8:00 pm.

Employees will not lose pay for leaving to vote before the end of their shift if it is within the four hour period, and Managers must approve schedules and provide appropriate coverage.
