Greetings Mayor and Council,

Please see the attached notice from Jerry Dobrovolny. A short summary of the notice is as follows:

- Placement of election/political signage is regulated in the City of Vancouver through the Sign By-law and Street and Traffic By-law.
- On City property:
  - Election/political signage is only tolerated between the backs of sidewalks and the adjoining private property and on poster cylinders.
  - Improperly placed signs and posters will be impounded, the impoundment charge ranges from \$100 to \$300 per sign.
- On private property, election/political signs less than 3.0m2 and free standing do not require a permit.

## RE: Information Regarding Election / Political Signage in City of Vancouver

Placement of election/political signage is regulated in the City of Vancouver through the Sign By-law and Street and Traffic By-law. Enclosed is information on the City's approach to regulating election/political signage to help you in adhering to the law during the upcoming election period.

Signs on street right-of-way are regulated by the Street and Traffic By-law:

- Election/political signage is not allowed on City property including, but not limited to:
  - the area between the sidewalk and the street
  - o boulevards or street centre medians (including on Boundary Road)
  - o poles
  - o structures such as utility or post boxes
  - o sidewalks and roadways
- **Exception:** Election/political signage is acceptable on City property during an election only between the backs of sidewalks and an adjoining private property with permission of the property owner.
- Exception: Election/political material may be posted using the City's poster cylinders located on designated lamp standards throughout the city. Find a map online at: <a href="http://vancouver.ca/doing-business/posters-and-signs-on-city-property.aspx">http://vancouver.ca/doing-business/posters-and-signs-on-city-property.aspx</a>
- Impounding of signs: All improperly placed signs and posters on City property will be impounded and stored at Engineering Services, 5th Floor, 507 West Broadway at the expense of the party/candidate involved. If a sign is removed, it can be recovered from this location from 9am-5pm on weekdays. Under the Impounding By-law, the City is authorized to charge for the removal of unlawfully placed signs on City streets. The impoundment charge ranges from \$100.00 to \$300.00 per sign or display based on the amount of staff and equipment required for removal.

Signs on private property are regulated by the Sign By-law:

• Election/political signs are allowed on private property. A sign that is less than 3.0m<sup>2</sup> and free standing does not require a permit. A sign that is located in a window and covering a maximum of 30% of the glass surface does not require a permit.
