**Subject:** Upcoming info bulletin: City wants your King Tides photos to help predict our future shoreline

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Dear Mayor and Council,

King tides are extreme high tide events that happen twice a year. As part of the City's efforts to educate the public on sea level rise and compare with our existing flood data from the Coastal Flood Risk Assessment (CFRA) program, we are inviting citizens to capture photos of the shoreline during November's king tides, which happen from November 23 until November 30, and upload them to our Sea Level Rise Story Map: [vancouver.ca/kingtides](http://vancouver.ca/kingtides).

As sea levels continue to rise over time, the regular tides of the future could look like king tides of today. By capturing photos of the waterfront, citizens are able to visualize what our shoreline could look in the future if no adaptation measure were taken.

An information bulletin (IB) is scheduled to be released on Monday.
