Sadhu, I am writing further to your letter to me of February 27, 2018, and to our phone call meeting on Tuesday regarding the FIFA bid. The phone call was a good opportunity to exchange information on the bid.

Yesterday, representatives of the involved senior provincial and federal governments, supported with legal counsel, collectively held their first meeting on the FIFA 2026 World Cup bid. Based on that meeting, we now understand that no other provincial jurisdiction will be providing either guarantees or indemnities to FIFA or host cities at this time.

Yesterday's meeting also appeared to indicate that while the federal government is working toward obtaining final approvals of certain bid elements it wishes to present, elements such as the broad requirements for host country guarantees will be restricted significantly by Canada through modifications that recognize the limitation of Canada's jurisdiction, as well as its own fiscal policies established for past major international event undertakings. FIFA's proposals on tax exemptions are one such item that will be restricted.

Finally, yesterday's meeting appeared to convey an understanding that federal participation and funding in providing security for the FIFA events will be limited solely to those matters under Canada's direct and narrow statutory responsibilities. These include for example, protection of international dignitaries and border/airport services and security. We understand that federal government does not intend on providing indemnities or services beyond those set out in its own mandates.

In regard to the business case and analysis of risks requested in Ministers Beare's letter of September 2017, I understand through your last letter that such a submission is not available at this time.

The provincial government takes very seriously any requests for guarantees and indemnities, whether for itself or its provincially-owned Crown corporations. In this respect, it is essential that the Province fully understand the scope, costs and risks of entering into such arrangements. In the absence of such information, we are unable to take forward and properly advise our Cabinet and Treasury Board on whether such requests should be

considered further. This view also appears to be shared by other jurisdictions based on yesterday's call.

Referring to your letter, I can comment on the following:

- You confirmed that no formal request for support has been presented to the Province to date, but suggested that the Province has been requested to review the government guarantees to confirm the obligations that fall within the Province's jurisdiction. The Province has completed a very preliminary review of the proposed guarantees, however, given the broadness and vagueness of the proposed requirements, this has been extremely difficult.
- You confirmed that guarantees may be planned to be sought from various parties, including the Province, and that the City may be contemplating, among other things, requesting an indemnity from the Province as part of a proposed Multiparty Agreement. However, I note that to date there has been no such request or an suitable analysis of the risks to BC taxpayers associated with such requests.
- You confirmed that the City expects direct participation in the bid by the B.C. Pavilion Corporation (PAVCO) as owner of the BC Place Stadium. I can confirm that the Province has worked hard with PAVCO to provide a bid response that is suitable and appropriate within PAVCO's authority.
- You noted that it has been communicated by the Canadian Soccer Association (CSA) that consistent with past practices, FIFA does not permit any modifications. This includes any modification, any cover letters or side agreements that may be construed as modifying the underlying agreements. We have noted that many developments have been occurring amongst bidding host cities and the CSA recently, and that this has affected how various bids will likely be submitted by host cities.

The Province remains supportive of the City in proceeding to complete and submit its 2026 World Cup Host City bid. Becoming a Host city we expect, will be a great opportunity for the City to once again showcase itself.

We are pleased to help the City through our efforts with PAVCO and we support the City in continuing to pursue further support from Canada and FIFA in the interests of securing protections necessary for fulfilling host city obligations should the City become successful in that bid. In the event that a business case and thorough analysis of risks becomes available, we would be pleased to review that information further.

Good Tuesday morning,

Prime Minister Justin Trudeau's tour of aluminum and steel plants in Canada is taking him to Hamilton today, where he will enjoy a brief tour and meet with workers of Stelco Hamilton Works at 9:30 a.m.

He will then participate in a roundtable with steel industry leaders at the Sheraton Hamilton Hotel at 11:45 a.m.

And then finally at 2 p.m., Mr. Trudeau will tour the ArcelorMittal Dofasco plant in nearby Burlington.

In nearby Toronto, Science and Sport and Persons with Disabilities Minister Kirsty Duncan is making what's being called a major sport announcement at 9 a.m. at BMO Field, alongside Canada Soccer's general secretary Peter Montopoli. Could it be related to Canada's joint bid with the U.S. and Mexico for the 2026 World Cup?

Transport Minister Marc Garneau is announcing new actions under the government's Oceans Protection Plan at noon in Vancouver. He'll have a media availability following the speech at the Coast Coal Harbour Hotel at 12:30 p.m.

Innovation, Science, and Economic Development Minister Navdeep Bains, who's also responsible for the six federal economic development agencies, is announcing funding this morning in Victoria for projects aimed at supporting Indigenous peoples and businesses across Western Canada. They are funded under the auspices of Western Economic Diversification Canada.

The announcement goes at 9 a.m. (Pacific time) at the Songhees Innovation Centre.

From there, Mr. Bains is heading to the scenic B.C. island of Haida Gwaii, located off the coast of Prince Rupert, to make an announcement about high-speed internet service for Canadians living in rural and remote communities, under the government's Connect to Innovate program.

He'll be joined by B.C. Citizens' Services Minister Jinny Sims for the 5 p.m. announcement at the Haida Heritage Centre in Skidegate.

Employment, Workforce Development, and Labour Minister Patty Hajdu is meeting with local female leaders in Thunder Bay, Ont., which she represents in the House, to discuss measures in the 2018 budget aimed at promoting women in the workplace. She'll be at the Scandinavian Home Society Restaurant at 8:30 a.m.

Defence Minister Harjit Sajjan is visiting Kelowna, B.C. for a 1 p.m. (Pacific time) speech at the British Columbia Dragoons Armoury to highlight the Canadian Armed Forces'

summer employment program for students serving in the reserves. He will be joined by Liberal MP Stephen Fuhr, who represents the city in the House.

NDP MP and party critic for women's equality Sheila Malcolmson is in New York City until March 16 to participate in the 62nd session of the UN Commission for Status of Women as part of the Canadian delegation.

The Belgian royal couple are spending Tuesday in Ottawa, with another full day of events lined up as part of their weeklong official state visit to Canada.

Today, King Philippe and Queen Mathilde will attend a Sustainable Development Goals breakfast at the Chateau Laurier, open a seminar on multilingual education at the University of Ottawa, drop by the Belgian Embassy, and visit the National Gallery, Museum of Nature, and Canadian War Museum. When they arrive at the War Museum at 3 p.m., they will be greeted by Veterans Affairs Minister Seamus O'Regan.

In the evening, the royal couple will attend the Diamond Mine Experience and Reception hosted at the Nature Museum before hosting an official concert and dinner reception at the Canadian Museum of History.
