## **Key Questions**

The outdoor pool recommendations do not meet the Board direction for a quick start pool. Does SMT support the outdoor pool direction/proposed location for the new outdoor destination pool?

The draft recommendations recommend continued phase-out of the wading pools, but does not include locational criteria for spray parks, signaling that this will be included in the PRSMP. Do we need an interim solution for Park Development?

Should we **renew the Kerrisdale pool on-site**?

Should VAC be rebuilt as a destination or community scale pool?

Confirm direction on **sport training vs sport hosting** aquatic facilities in Vancouver.






#### Neighbourhood – 2 km radius




#### INSIGHT

We learned that Hillcrest is a destination for the whole city, and that people are willing to travel.






#### **INSIGHT**

"My teenagers would like more "things to do" in local pools - rope swings, large slides, lazy rivers, etc. There are few of these facilities in Vancouver, so the demand is high at those locations (e.g. Hillcrest). In past years, we have frequently gone to Ladner Leisure Centre/ **Eileen Dailly instead, as well as the UBC pool."**





### **Facilities at a Glance**

#### Hillcrest

City-Wide (Destination), Indoor/Outdoor 2010, legacy component 2011

- Newest facility in VPB
- Only City-Wide (Destination) facility
- Greatest number of annual visits (675,000 in 2014)

#### Kensington

Neighbourhood, Indoor 1979

- Currently operates cost effectively, but is an aging facility
- Minor upgrades recommended in 2011 study to improve accessibility and change rooms
- Warmer pool temperature

#### Renfrew

Neighbourhood, Indoor 1963, renovated 1970, 2005 + 2010

- Second lowest subsidy per swim
- Third most well-used facility after Hillcrest and Killarney
- Operates at high efficiency rate

Killarney Community, Indoor 2006

- One of the newest facilities in VPB
- Second most highly visited pool



#### INSIGHT

Vancouver Aquatic Centre, Kerrisdale, Britannia, Lord Byng and Templeton are the most underutilized pools. Together, they make up only 34% of all visits to indoor pools in VPB.



#### **Facilities at a Glance**

Lord Byng Neighbourhood, Indoor 1974

- Never renovated, one of the oldest facilities in VPB
- Performs in midrange of subsidies and operating capacities
- 2011 study recommended combining fitness and considered exploring a relationship with the schools to increase usage

Britannia Community, Indoor 1975, renovated 1998

- Recommended for upgrades in 2011 study for infrastructure and range of user experience
- Overall masterplan currently underway which will impact the future of this facility

#### Templeton

Neighbourhood, Indoor 1974

- Never renovated, one of the oldest facilities in VPB -
- Received third highest subsidy per swim in 2014
- 2011 study recommended replacement with high profile facility
- Service overlap with Britannia


#### Kerrisdale

Neighbourhood, Indoor 1955, renovated 1996

- Oldest facility in VPB
- **Operates at 50% capacity and is the second lowest** efficiency pool in the VPB
- 2011 study recommended as a priority for replacement










#### Vancouver Aquatic Centre

Community (Unique), Indoor 1974


- High demand for diving, synchro, water polo and elite aquatic based training
- Operating at 25% operating capacity, making it the least efficient pool in the VPB
- Given its low efficiency, it operates with the highest subsidy per swim, over 3 times the deficit of the newest facilities
- Previous studies noted problematic structure and cladding from a seismic perspective
- 2011 study recommended a new facility to address current and emerging sport aquatics, along with fitness and spa amenities
- Is within the area of highest expected population growth over the next 24 years

## **INSIGHTS**

**37%** said they visited outdoor pools once per week or more during summer months

**38%** of respondents would be encouraged to visit outdoor pools more often if improvements were made to the existing pool near their home or work.

11% of survey respondents said (in an open ended call for comments) they want improved changing facilities.



## **INSIGHTS**

80% of respondents stated that their primary reason for visiting an outdoor pool was for fun and socializing.

**19%** indicated that they think Vancouver needs more outdoor facilities



## INSIGHT

The total capacity for swimming in public outdoor pools in Vancouver is at least as high as cities that have more pools.







## **Facilities at a Glance**

#### Kitsilano

Community + Destination, Outdoor 1979

- Extremely long length, perfect for length swimming
- Located on cycling route, walking path, and tourist area
- Connected to the city's most popular Kitsilano Beach
- Change rooms need upgrading

#### Maple Grove

Community + Neighbourhood, Outdoor 1995

- Popular venue for children's groups and family days
- Large green space good for picnics
- Quiet location within a park
- No adequate change rooms

#### Hillcrest

City-wide, Outdoor 2010

- Located nearby Queen Elizabeth park
- Outdoor pool is extremely popular during warm weather
- Connected to large facility with fitness, arenas, indoor pool

#### **New Brighton**

Community, Outdoor 1973

- Limited programming, mostly recreational use
- Expansive views to North Shore Mountains and water
- Located within New Brighton Park, but pool area has only a small green area

#### **Second Beach**

Community + Destination, Outdoor 1995

- Located off of seawall in high traffic and tourist area
- Large pool deck area, but minimal shading
- Second most popular outdoor pool in the system
- No adequate changerooms



The use of spray decks and wading pools is not currently measured.



Experiences provided by wading pools and spray parks provide an introduction to water.

Spray parks have been found to be better at doing so, in part by being more socially inclusive and accessible for longer seasons.

The Park Board wading pools do not meet current Ministry of Health legislation. Our local Health Authority strongly encourages that they be removed or converted to meet the updated legislation.



The Park Board currently has an ongoing, phased program to convert wading pools into spray parks.

Significant retrofitting would be required to meet the legislation, regardless of chlorination technology.

Replacement would be more cost effective than retrofitting.



## Spray Parks + Wading Pools Recommendations

Spray Park

Wading Pool

Continue to phase-out all wading pools in the City, converting to spray parks where feasible, pending local criteria to be identified through the Parks and Recreation Service Master Plan as well as consultation with communities. Where possible, design spray parks in a way that water can be recycled for park use, ie: adjacent irrigation or water features.


