Park Board's position:

- The Park Board has been very consistent over the last 3 years that it does not feel this event is an appropriate use of park space. It violates our non-smoking by-laws and has negative impacts to regular park users, facilities and residents.
- The Park Board has declined to give organizers a permit as the event does not meet our criteria, and violates our no-smoking by-laws in parks.
- We have worked with our partners at the City and VPD to encourage organizers to go to an alternative location such as the PNE, but thus far have not been successful.
- Despite our concerns we will do everything we can in cooperation with our partners at the City, VPD, VFRS etc. to ensure public safety and minimize public and park impacts during this event.
- Why can't Park Rangers enforce by-laws and stop it from happening? The VPD has advised that due to the size of the crowds, it is not safe for Park Rangers or police to attempt to enforce non-smoking by-laws at the event.
- As per last year the adjacent seawall, the Sunset Concession and the Aquatic Centre will be closed on April 20th. The VAC will also be closed on April 19th for electrical upgrades.

Protecting Sunset Beach Park:

- We are looking at ways to better protect the wet and soggy turf in the park this year so the public does not experience a loss of use after the event.
- Organizers informed us today they are investing \$30K in 14,000 square feet in "Ultra Deck" a breathable, interlocking material that protects turf. The decking will extend from the front of the stage and down the four aisles of the booth area. It will be installed Apr. 19.
- The organizers are also required to protect the turf with sheets of plywood during the set up and tear down of event equipment.
- The stage infrastructure will be set up on a hill to avoid damage to the field area of the park.
- We are hopeful this avoids similar damage to the field as last year, where Sunset Park was closed for 6 weeks to do field mitigation.

Costs:

- Park Board and City of Vancouver are tracking all incremental costs related to managing this event and will report to Park Board and Council on those costs in the weeks following April 20th.
- Last year's event cost the City almost \$250 K, nearly \$40 K of those were Park Board costs. Of that bill, 4/20 organizers reimbursed the Park Board nearly \$7K for turf restoration.

Operational key messages:

- Additional resources have been assigned to Sunset Beach Park, including:
 - o Park Board operations staff will be on-site during set-up and tear-down to ensure Park Board assets, including grass areas, are protected
 - o Park Ranger crews will be positioned along the seawall starting at 7:00am to inform/educate park users about the initiative
 - o Lifeguards will be deployed to the event site
 - o Extra portable washrooms will be positioned at Sunset Beach Park to support the event
 - o Extra garbage bins will be also be deployed to the event site
 - o Sunset Beach Concession will be locked down for its protection
 - The Park Board and Vancouver Police Department have worked together to inform the local community about the protest:
 - o Notification letters were distributed to nearby residents and businesses on April13
 - o Notification posters were distributed and displayed at the Vancouver Aquatic Centre and the West End Community Centre
 - o Vancouver Aquatic Centre will be closed for the day and customers have been informed of the closure
 - Sunset Beach Park will be subject to an intense post-event clean-up by Park Board operations staff (similar to approach used for Celebration of Light event)

Park Board statement on closure of Sunset Beach Park and field

The Park Board will attempt to have Sunset Beach park and field open to the public in six weeks, by early June. This revised estimate of field impacts after the 4/20 marijuana event comes after a full inspection of the field by senior park operations staff this morning. A forecast of hot and dry weather this week will greatly assist us in preparing the wet field for rehabilitation.

Park operations staff did a preliminary inspection in the immediate aftermath of the event and fenced the field to protect the damaged field from public use over the weekend. Park Board and City staff worked together all night after 4/20 to clean event debris on the field, but there were still objects such as glass and discarded edibles on the field that posed a danger to the public. The fencing was installed on Saturday morning partially as a protective measure to ensure safety, particularly for children and dogs.

The fencing used to close the field was repurposed by Park Board as it was ordered before 4/20 as protection for new plant beds, young trees and vulnerable species such as eucalyptus and palms. The fencing was removed from these plantings and used to close the field on Saturday morning after the preliminary inspection.

The process to rehabilitate Sunset field involves the following steps:

- Drying the field requires a good long stretch of warm weather
- Cleaning the field ensuring debris such as cigarette butts, metals and glass are fully removed so machinery can operate
- Aerating the field Soils can become compacted through heavy use and thatch (a fibrous layer of dead grass stems, leaves and roots) can develop. Aeration, the process of puncturing the surface of the soil, mitigates this by allowing oxygen into the roots, carbon dioxide to escape and water and nutrients to more easily flow through the soil. Aeration is necessary for healthy turf grass.
- Topdressing the field This process involves spreading an organic mixture usually sand, soil, clay or compost or a mixture of these materials over the field. This helps even out the field, adding an extra element of safety for athletes. Topdressing is like a conditioner for athletic fields, giving turf a fuller feel and extra layer of protection.
- Seeding and germination waiting for the grass to grow enough so that public use does not damage the grass. With the right preparation, new turf will have shallow roots in about two weeks. This first stage of root growth is very sensitive and requires us to keep the public off the vulnerable young grass. In fact, all weight should be kept off the grass to allow for healthy, resilient turf with deep roots. This takes between 30-45 days in good conditions.

The Park Board understands that Sunset Beach Park is a much loved community asset, and provides vital recreation space for the dense downtown core. We regret any closure, but must take steps to ensure the long term viability of this field which also experienced major impacts in 2017 during the same event. Sunset Park field was closed for 10 weeks last spring after the 4/20 event.

The Park Board will tally all costs associated with the field restoration and other related expenses and will be billing organizers for these costs. A full accounting of 4/20 costs will be released by the City and Park Board when all associated expenses are in.

Organizers did install about \$30,000 worth of plastic turf protection around the main stage at this year's event, which helped to mitigate the cumulative damage.

The Park Board will continue to work with partners at the City to encourage organizers to find a more suitable, alternate location for the event in future years.

After a full inspection by Howard Normann this morning, we have revised the field closure estimate downward by a month. This will be issued to the media in about half an hour, and Chair Mackinnon and Howard Normann are going to speak to the Early Edition tomorrow morning.

Park Board statement on 4/20 marijuana event at Sunset Beach Park

The 4/20 marijuana event will take place again this year in Sunset Beach Park, against the wishes of the elected Park Board Commissioners. The Board continues to have significant concerns about the event's impact on residents, the park and facilities that serve our community.

The Park Board does not believe this event is an appropriate use of park space because it violates our no smoking by-laws and has negative consequences for park users and infrastructure. The Board has declined to give organizers a permit as the event does not meet our criteria for issuing a special event permit.

In the best interest of the public the Park Board will do everything it can - in cooperation with partners at the City, VPD, VFRS, BC Ambulance and health authorities - to ensure public safety is maintained and to minimize public and park impacts during this event.

We are looking at ways to better protect the wet and soggy turf in the park so the public does not experience a loss of park and playing field use, as was the case last year. Event organizers have told us they will place a protective covering, at their expense, around the main stage area to protect the turf at this year's 4/20 event.

Park Rangers have gone door to door in the vicinity of Sunset Beach to hand deliver leaflets outlining plans for the event and to inform residents of significant crowds, traffic impacts and potential health concerns to those with sensitivity to smoke.

As in 2017, the adjacent seawall, the Sunset Concession and the Vancouver Aquatic Centre (VAC) will be temporarily closed on April 20th. Please note that the VAC will also be closed April 19th for electrical upgrades to the facility.

The Park Board will continue to work with partners at the City to encourage organizers to find an alternate location for the event in future years.

Hi Dan,

I agree that MedTech should not be staged in the Jervis Street parking lot. The lot is specifically for Emergency Services and COV staff.

The area north of the stage is congested with organizer equipment, is a thoroughfare for event attendees and will have 6 toilets close by.

I am in total agreement that the best location for a first aid tent is at the bottom of the stairs, directly west of the pump house.

Other options may be the roof of the pump house (usually occupied by the organizer) or the grass "island" along the Beach Avenue side.

Please inform MedTech that they may not set up in either the Jervis Street lot or immediately north of the stage.

Perhaps Ken or Matt have other ideas of where MedTech can set up.

Hi All,

I spoke to Doug House of MedTech EMS today and had a conversation about the location of the medical tents. He will be amending the location of first aid post #1 to the street level behind the stage. I don't have an issue with this provided that the location where he chooses to set up is far enough away not to impact operations at our unified command post. He requested his post to be right next to the fire truck and to be included in emergency ops but it would have been a huge impact especially because we're now talking about fencing to limit public intrusion into the command space.

I did reiterate my recommendation that it should be by the bottom of the stairs as it offers a location that won't be directly impacted by marijuana smoke and loud noise. Ultimately, we're flexible with either location though I would recommend we change the location in the plan to reflect the stage location.

What's different this year:

Watering Station for attendees, set up by Engineering at request of health authorities to ensure hydration. New this year.

Enhanced garbage collection to ensure site cleanliness – organizers providing 25 totes (5 more than last year) and volunteers to collect garbage through-out day and deposit in central repository at triangle where Beach intersects Pacific. This will ensure bins do not overflow during day waiting for sanitation pick up, as happened last year.

Seawall hard closure and DETOUR from Bidwell to Aquatic Centre with Rangers stationed at both ends with signs and flyers to notify public. Last year detour was optional.

• Ten more porta-potties provided by organizers, for a total of 130 washrooms on site as compared to 120 last year

• Site set up occurring TODAY in daylight hours, not OVERNIGHT as last year. This to minimize residential noise and traffic impacts.

Costs will be carefully tracked and we will attempt to do some cost recovery. Last year there was no attempt.

Residential notification of event. Rangers went door to door last week with notices.

VAC and Seawall closure:

Vancouver Police (VPD) have advised likely thousands of people will attend the 420 event.

• As a precautionary measure, the Vancouver Aquatic Centre (VAC) will be closed for the day. Impacts such as: access, egress, and air quality cannot be predicted.

• The seawall will be closed to all users from the Aquatic Centre at Burrard St. to Inukshuk at Bidwell St.

On the day:

• The Vancouver Police Department and other partners are assigning additional resources for public safety and to minimize impact on our park, beach, community and surrounding businesses.

• Park Board operations staff will be on-site during set-up and tear-down to ensure Park Board assets, including grass areas, are protected

General Manager Malcolm Bromley will be stationed at the on-site Command Centre on the day of

the event and Park Board operations staff will have a strong presence to ensure that Park Board interests are fully considered in the event plan and execution

• Park Ranger crews will be positioned along the seawall <u>starting at 7:00am</u> to inform/educate park users about the initiative

- · Lifeguards will be deployed to the event site
- Extra portable washrooms will be positioned at Sunset Beach Park to support the event

• Extra garbage bins will be also be deployed to the event site (80 from the Park Board and 50 from organizers)

Sunset Beach Concession will be locked down for its protection

• Sunset Beach Park will be subject to an intense post-event clean-up by Park Board operations staff (similar to approach used for Celebration of Light event)

Public notification

• The Park Board and Vancouver Police Department have worked together to inform the local community about the protest; specifically:

- o Notification letters were distributed to nearby residents and businesses on April 13
- o Notification posters were distributed and displayed at the Vancouver Aquatic Centre and the West End Community Centre
- o Vancouver Aquatic Centre will be closed for the day and customers were informed of the closure

Costs:

• Park Board and City of Vancouver are tracking all incremental costs related to managing this event and will report to Park Board and Council on those costs in the weeks following April 20th.

Operational key messages:

• The Park Board is working closely with partners at the City, Vancouver Police Department, Vancouver Fire & Rescue Services, BC Ambulance Service as well as other agencies to ensure a safe and orderly event.

- \cdot To reduce neighbourhood impacts and congestion on the morning of the event, we have allowed the organizers to load in larger infrastructure on April 19.
- The Organizer and Parks are both arranging for contracted security overnight to protect any assets on Park property and to prevent early vendor load in. VPD will be available via 911 to intervene if needed.



Hello Dana,

The figure of 12 toilets per 1,000 attendees is a guideline established by Vancouver Coastal Health which has been incorporated into the Letter of Expectation this year as well as in past years. While this figure represents an important planning metric, we recognize that many events (including past 4/20 initiatives) do not meet this standard and apply discretion to ensure that the number of toilets supplied is sufficient to support event attendance.

The Park Board will be supplying an additional 10 toilets this year, over and above the 70 that you're providing, for a total of 80 toilets. This figure is consistent with the number of toilets supplied at previous 4/20 initiatives, and based on supplier feedback indicating fill rates in excess of 95% at the end of the event, is considered to be the minimum quantity required to service an event of this size.

We have discussed the toilet plan and we are complying with the number and placement of toilets as agreed upon. But this letter seems to say we should have far more toilets than we're going to have.

Last year, the Park Board brought in extra toilets which we didn't expect. Is that expected to happen again this year? We're hoping we have the toilet situation under control and there will be no need for the Park to invest in more toilet facilities.

Park Board statement on 4/20 marijuana event at Sunset Beach Park

The 4/20 marijuana event will take place again this year in Sunset Beach Park, against the wishes of the elected Park Board Commissioners. The Board continues to have significant concerns about the event's impact on residents, the park and facilities that serve our community.

The Park Board does not believe this event is an appropriate use of park space because it violates our no smoking by-laws and has negative consequences for park users and infrastructure. The Board has declined to give organizers a permit as the event does not meet our criteria for issuing a special event permit.

In the best interest of the public the Park Board will do everything it can - in cooperation with partners at the City, VPD, VFRS, BC Ambulance and health authorities to ensure public safety is maintained and to minimize public and park impacts during this event.

We are looking at ways to better protect the wet and soggy turf in the park so the public does not experience a loss of park and playing field use, as in last year. Event organizers have told us they will place a protective covering, at their expense, around the main stage area to protect the turf at this year's 4/20 event.

Park Rangers have gone door to door in the vicinity of Sunset Beach to hand deliver leaflets outlining plans for the event and to inform residents of significant crowds, traffic impacts and potential health concerns to those with sensitivity to smoke.

As in 2017, the adjacent seawall, the Sunset Concession and the Vancouver Aquatic Centre (VAC) will be temporarily closed on April 20th. Please note that the VAC will also be closed April 19th for electrical upgrades to the facility.

The Park Board will continue to work with partners at the City to encourage organizers to find an alternate location for the event in future years.

Dear Commissioners,

I am writing to update you on the efforts taken by Park Board staff, in conjunction with key partners, to mitigate impacts to park users, nearby residents, other stakeholders, and Sunset Beach Park during this Friday's 4/20 protest event.

On March 6, 2017, in response to a permit application submitted by the 420 event organizers, the Board passed a <u>motion</u> to "not permit or approve future 420 and/or cannabis day events on any property that falls under Park Board jurisdiction". As a result, the 2018 protest at Sunset Beach Park will once again be moving forward as an unsanctioned and unpermitted event. In situations of this nature, the role of the Park Board and its partners is to protect our assets and ensure the health and safety of protest participants and the general public.

Set-up for the event (large infrastructure only) will begin on Thursday, April 19, 2018, between 9:00am and 7:00pm. Providing access to the park the day before the event is consistent with the approach taken in 2017, which significantly reduced neighborhood impacts and enabled Park Board staff to better monitor set-up activities and ensure park assets were protected and safety rules followed. Additional load-in will continue on April 20, 2018, between 6:00am and 11:00am, with the protest event taking place between 11:00am and 8:00pm. The post-event site clean-up and tear-down will begin immediately following the event at 8:00pm. It will wrap-up by 10:00pm that evening in order to minimize impacts on adjacent residents, with any remaining site clean-up and tear-down to be completed the next day (April 21, 2018).

This year's 4/20 protest is expected to be carried out in a manner very similar to that of prior years, with the following exceptions:

- Organizers will be providing approximately 14,000 square feet of portable flooring to protect the grass at Sunset Beach Park; this grass protection will be deployed in front of the stage area and also in the 4 aisles between vendor booths; and
- A second video screen will be erected on the northern corner of the Second Beach Park parking lot; this video screen and accompanying speakers will broadcast safety messages and assist in directing sound away from nearby residents.

Flyers and posters were delivered to area residents and businesses on April 13, 2018, advising of the protest, the anticipated impacts, and potential mitigation strategies. These neighborhood notification resources were distributed in a three block radius of Sunset Beach Park.

No Park Board services will be used to enable or support this initiative. As a result, the Sunset Beach Concession and Vancouver Aquatic Centre will be closed for the entire day on April 20, 2018. Electrical power at Sunset Beach Park will also be shut off and unavailable to the event. At the request of Vancouver Coastal Health (VCH) and the Vancouver Police Department (VPD), a single water connection will be provided to support a mobile water refilling station so that event participants can have access to clean water.

Our Park Rangers, Park Operations, Special Events, and Communications teams have developed a detailed and comprehensive safety plan, and have participated in an integrated planning process with key partners at the City, the VPD, Vancouver Fire & Rescue Services (VF&RS), Office of Emergency Management, BC Ambulance Services, and VCH to ensure that the event is executed as expected.

On the day of the event, I will be in regular communication with Command Centre personnel and Park Board staff to monitor the event and be receiving hourly situation reports from our VPD partners. Staff from our Park Operations, Special Events, and Communications teams will also be on site. Public communication on the event day will be led by the VPD using their social media channels.

We are carefully tracking all costs associated with 4/20 and will provide Commissioners with a comprehensive post-event debrief.

I spoke to Inspector Glenn Newman today. He is the Bronze Commander of VPD resources at Sunset Beach on April 20. He thoughts were completely consistent with Inspector Joanne McCormick as I relayed them last week. (that it is essentially the Parks Board's call and that the VPD is prepared to assist the Parks Board in the lawful mandate to manage and protect the parks of Vancouver). Glenn's additional thought is that we have a strong indication from last year that if the site is recreated in the same way as last year, then the crowd behavior, the impacts on residents, and traffic etc are manageable. If changes are made to the site, there may be effects that compromise safety or impact traffic, or residents that are not anticipate, therefore his preference would be that the site design be kept similar to last year.

Below are my thoughts only. I will meet with our Commanders tomorrow and make sure the VPD provides a response (if you don't hear from Joanne today.)

More and bigger screens and lighting negatively impacts residents in the area.

I was at the sight meeting when Jeremiah said the additional (new) screen would be² mounted on the speaker tower that was there last year (same size tower, same place.) I don't see why the Parksboard wouldn't hold the line there, out of respect for the residents.

If the new elevated deck/ (additional stage) is part of, or attached to, the main stage, then this IS pretty well consistent with what was described at the sight meeting.² Although I don't remember any talk of a bigger screen at the stage.

How much of the grass field will 100,000 ft of flooring cover?² (This is NOT a commitment to protect the park. And Jeremiah and co. Do not have a track record for keeping promises. Perhaps after seeing an invoice for the flooring, you could consider allowing the additional lights and way larger screen.)

Park Board statement on closure of Sunset Beach park and field

The Park Board will attempt to have Sunset Beach park and field open to the public in six weeks, by early June. This revised estimate of field impacts after the 4/20 marijuana event comes after a full inspection of the field by senior park operations staff this morning. A forecast of hot and dry weather this week which will greatly assist us in preparing the wet field for rehabilitation.

Park operations staff did a preliminary inspection in the immediate aftermath of the event and fenced the field to protect the damaged field from public use over the weekend. Park Board and City staff worked together all night after 4/20 to clean event debris on the field, but there were still objects such as glass and discarded edibles on the field that posed a danger to the

public. The fencing was installed on Saturday morning partially as a protective measure to ensure safety, particularly for children and dogs.

The fencing used to close the field was repurposed by Park Board as it was ordered before 4/20 as protection for new plant beds, young trees and vulnerable species such as eucalyptus and palms. The fencing was removed from these plantings and used to close the field on Saturday morning after the preliminary inspection.

The process to rehabilitate Sunset field involves the following steps:

- Drying the field requires a good long stretch of warm weather
- · Cleaning the field ensuring debris such as cigarette butts, metals and glass are fully removed so machinery can operate
- Aerating the field Soils can become compacted through heavy use and thatch (a fibrous layer of dead grass stems, leaves and roots) can develop. Aeration, the process of puncturing the surface of the soil, mitigates this by allowing oxygen into the roots, carbon dioxide to escape and water and nutrients to more easily flow through the soil. Aeration is necessary for healthy turf grass.
- Topdressing the field This process involves spreading an organic mixture usually sand, soil, clay or compost or a mixture of these materials over the field. This helps even out the field, adding an extra element of safety for athletes. Topdressing is like a conditioner for athletic fields, giving turf a fuller feel and extra layer of protection.
- Seeding and germination waiting for the grass to grow enough so that public use does not damage the grass. With the right preparation, new turf will have shallow roots in about two weeks. This first stage of root growth is very sensitive and requires us to keep the public off the vulnerable young grass. In fact, all weight should be kept off the grass to allow for healthy, resilient turf with deep roots. This takes between 30-45 days in good conditions.

The Park Board understands that Sunset Beach Park is a much loved community asset, and provides vital recreation space for the dense downtown core. We regret any closure, but must take steps to ensure the long term viability of this field which also experienced major impacts in 2017 during the same event. Sunset Park field was closed for 10 weeks last spring after the 4/20 event.

The Park Board will tally all costs associated with the field restoration and other related expenses and will be billing organizers for these costs. A full accounting of 4/20 costs will be released by the City and Park Board when all associated expenses are in.

Organizers did install about \$30,000 worth of plastic turf protection around the main stage at this year's event, which helped to mitigate the cumulative damage.

The Park Board will continue to work with partners at the City to encourage organizers to find a more suitable, alternate location for the event in future years.



Letter of Expectations 4/20 Protest - Sunset Beach Park - April 20, 2018

Dear Jeremiah & Dana,

As organizers of the 4/20 protest, you have announced your intention to use Sunset Beach Park as the site of your protest in 2018. In its current form, the initiative violates a number of Vancouver Park Board (Park Board) and City of Vancouver (City) bylaws and creates a significant strain on Park Board and City resources.

On March 6, 2017, the Park Board and its Board of Commissioners did not approve a permit for this initiative as requested by Dana Larsen. As a result, the 2018 initiative will be moving forward as an unsanctioned and unpermitted event. In all situations of this nature, the Park Board and City's role is to ensure the health and safety of protest participants and the general public, while minimizing disruptions to local emergency services and the surrounding community.

An interdepartmental Park Board and City staff team, including the Park Board's senior leadership, has reviewed your initiative. This letter outlines the requirements we expect your group to meet when executing the 4/20 protest on April 20, 2018 at Sunset Beach Park.

Set-Up Location/Times

- Sunset Beach Park set-up time April 19, 2018, from 9:00am to 7:00pm and April 20, 2018, from 6:00am to 11:00am
- Event time April 20, 2018, from 11:00am to 8:00pm
- Sunset Beach Park site clean-up and teardown April 20, 2018 from 8:00pm to 10:00pm
- Tear-down complete all structures to be removed from Sunset Beach Park no later than April 21, 2018, by 5:00pm

Traffic Management

- For public safety, the City of Vancouver will be altering traffic flow on Beach Avenue
- Based on current planning, Beach Avenue between Cardero and Thurlow Streets will be closed to traffic at 7:00am; vehicular traffic will be restricted to residential traffic only
- Vendor traffic will be allowed to access Beach Avenue up to approximately 7:00am; after that time, only emergency vehicles will be permitted access eastbound on Beach Avenue





- Vehicular traffic will not be permitted into Sunset Beach Park parking lot
- Should conditions warrant, the City of Vancouver reserves the right to alter traffic flow on streets adjacent to or near the event location

Site Safety

- First aid services and first aid staff must be provided and clearly identified (a minimum of three first aid tents are required on the event site)
- Volunteers must be clearly identified to assist with site access for emergency responders
- Radios must be provided to on-site emergency responders in order to allow for effective communication in the event of an emergency or threat to public safety
- Event organizers must provide all associated staff, including first aid and security personnel and volunteers, with the grid reference tool and site map, and require that these reference tools be used to ensure a coordinated emergency response
- Tents must be appropriately anchored for safety
- Tables are permitted for vending purposes only
- Vancouver Fire & Rescue Services will be issuing and posting a Fire Order restricting any open fires, barbeques, propane cooking stoves/torches, or any such equipment or appliances
- All building standpipes and hydrants must remain clear for safety
- Pallets and generators (with the exception of generators to support the amplification of music and speeches from the stage) are not permitted
- We understand one stage (located at the top of the Jervis Pump Station) and associated structures, including video screens, additional stage, and generator, will be erected; this stage and associated structures are to comply with the City of Vancouver Building Bylaw and must have the permits required under that bylaw
- No other structures, including but not limited to, video screens, additional stages and generators will be permitted
- Event organizers will comply with all directives issued by the Vancouver Park Board, the City of Vancouver, the Vancouver Police Department, Vancouver Fire & Rescue Services, and all other regulatory agencies/departments

Park Requirements

- Smoking is restricted to the event area; an appropriate amount of receptacles must be provided for the secure disposal of butts
- Non-slip plywood is required on grass area for load-in and load-out
- Grass protection must be provided in the area in front of the stage
- Portable washrooms must be provided for protest participants; Health Authority guidelines are 12 toilets per 1,000 attendees (7 for women and 5 for men); washrooms should be set-up in the skateboard area by the Sunset Beach Park parking lot
- No power is available at the event location
- Amplification of music/speeches must not exceed 75dbc, 150 feet from the front of the speakers, and 65dbc from the sidewalk; speakers must be angled towards the water





- Organizers will not permit sales, distribution, or consumption of cannabis in any form to minors
- Food trucks are not permitted on the event site
- Organizers are responsible for providing appropriate sanitation/recycling stations and the removal of all debris from the site post-event; this includes sifting of the sand on the beaches

Structure Safety

- Stage greater than 1,200mm (4 feet) from grade or larger than 40 square meters (430 square feet) in area require a building permit and/or a Letter of Assurance B1 B2 from a structural engineering service; the weight of the structure must adhere to the weight load restrictions provided by Metro Vancouver
- All pop-up tents and structures must be 'canopy' style only; structures may not have more than one wall; all structures must be secured
- 3 meters (10 feet) clearance must be maintained every 183 square meters (600 square feet) of tents/pop-ups to allow for emergency access/egress

Previous iterations of this event have caused additional event-related expenses for the Park Board and the City, including but not limited to park event fees, staffing expenses, sanitation costs, lost revenues, parking, etc. Further, in previous years the event has caused damage to Park Board assets, in particular the grass areas at Sunset Beach Park.

The Park Board and the City will conduct a post-event inspection and submit to you an invoice for payment of the abovementioned restoration and event-related expenses. The Park Board and the City explicitly reserve the right to commence appropriate legal action to recover these costs in the event that the invoice is not paid in full.

This event is in violation of Park Board Bylaws and the Park Board and the City explicitly reserve the right to prosecute any bylaw violations committed during the event.

Park Board statement on 4/20 marijuana event at Sunset Beach Park

The 4/20 marijuana event will take place again this year in Sunset Beach Park, against the wishes of the elected Park Board Commissioners. The Board continues to have significant concerns about the event's impact on residents, the park and facilities that serve our community.

The Park Board does not believe this event is an appropriate use of park space because it violates our no smoking by-laws and has negative consequences for park users and infrastructure. The Board has declined to give organizers a permit as the event does not meet our criteria for issuing a special event permit.

In the best interest of the public the Park Board will do everything it can - in cooperation with partners at the City, VPD, VFRS, BC Ambulance and health authorities to ensure public safety is maintained and to minimize public and park impacts during this event.

We are looking at ways to better protect the wet and soggy turf in the park so the public does not experience a loss of park and playing field use, as in last year. Event organizers have told us they will place a protective covering, at their expense, around the main stage area to protect the turf at this year's 4/20 event.

Park Rangers have gone door to door in the vicinity of Sunset Beach to hand deliver leaflets outlining plans for the event and to inform residents of significant crowds, traffic impacts and potential health concerns to those with sensitivity to smoke.

As in 2017, the adjacent seawall, the Sunset Concession and the Vancouver Aquatic Centre (VAC) will be temporarily closed on April 20th. Please note that the VAC will also be closed April 19th for electrical upgrades to the facility.

The Park Board will continue to work with partners at the City to encourage organizers to find an alternate location for the event in future years.

I would like to take this opportunity to summarize the Vancouver Park Board and City of Vancouver's understanding of the operational aspects of 420 at Sunset Beach Park that have emerged from our meetings on February 15 and February 22, 2018 and subsequent conversations. Consistent with past practice, a Letter of Expectations was also sent to you on April 13, 2018.

Infrastructure Set-Up

- Protec will set up most of the event infrastructure on April 19, from 9:00am to 7:00pm, with the remainder to be completed on April 20, beginning at 6:00am.
- Engineer stamped drawings will be provided for all structures.
- Organizers to mark locations for tents in compliance with Vancouver Fire and Rescue Services requirements
- Organizers will lay down Ultradek on the field in front of the stage and along the 4 aisles between the booths.
- Non-slip plywood will be put down on the grass area leading up to the path; no driving on grass is permitted; hand carting of materials only.
- Front of the house structure 8'x16' will be placed on the turf below the main stage for sound control and will be contained with a 4' fence.
- Generators require a 2'x2'x2' hole to be dug in the ground in the presence of the Park Board's archeologist; digging is
 not permitted within the drip line of any trees as it will damage the trees; ground scoping and electrical permit
 required.
- All electrical equipment and generators must be enclosed by 6' to 8' scrimmed fencing.

Stage Area

- Access to the stage area will be from the Jervis Street parking lot, between the east swing gate and first disability parking spot, where waste containers are normally located.
- The stage area will be fenced off to provide security for back-of-house operations; the entire area will be covered with non-slip plywood; the stage will be a mobile unit (SL100) with dimensions of 24'x20' plus a 4' riser; one 10'x20' tent will be set-up for artists and two portable washrooms within the fence line.
- There will be one 18' high 18'x9' video screen anchored by concrete blocks.
- Driving on the seawall is not permitted.
- Food trucks are not permitted at the Sunset Beach Park site.

Protest Schedule

- 6:00am volunteer organizers, security, and vendors arrive on site.
- 12:00noon to 8:00pm stage performances.
- 4:20pm 420.
- 8:00pm end of stage activation and music; clean-up and stage tear-down begins.
- 10:00pm event site is cleared.

Communications

- Event staff, volunteers, security, and MedTech staff will use both cell phones and radios onsite.
- Organizers will provide Command Post personnel with a security and medical team radio to enable the Command Post to monitor status of incidents (during an event of this size cellular coverage can be interrupted/unreliable).

Portable Washrooms

• Organizers will provide 70 portable washrooms at the Sunset Beach Park sport court including 14 units at the Jervis Lot area.

Security

• Organizers to provide overnight security guards on April 19.

- Approximately 12 security staff will be provided and onsite during the event.
- Security staff will begin at 7:00am.
- Security staff will be positioned primarily around the event stage.

Sound Management

- Speakers must be directed towards the water, away from residential buildings.
- Amplification of music/speeches must not exceed 75dbc, 150 feet from the front of the speakers, and 65dbc from the sidewalk.

Site Maintenance

- Sunset Beach Park is a large site and thousands of people are expected to attend the event; it is the organizers responsibility to ensure that an appropriate number of receptacles are available for safe butt disposal.
- Protest volunteers will clean the park and beach after the protest ends.
- Organizers will provide at least 25 garbage receptacles to hold clear garbage bags.

Volunteers

• There will be approximately 50 volunteers positioned throughout the site.

Medical First Aid

- MedTech has been contracted to provide first aid services.
- There will be 6 first aid attendants stationed at 3 first aid tents (2 per tent).
- There will be 3 tents on the site (1 with a stationary MedTech first aid vehicle), each easily identifiable by flags attached to them.
- Volunteers and staff will carry collapsible flags that can be used in an emergency to indicate the location of potential victims.

Safety Messaging

- Vendor booth will post signs that read 'No sales to minors'.
- Locations of first aid tents will be communicated/displayed on the 420 Vancouver website and posted on the 420 site map.
- Safety announcements will be made hourly onsite from the stage and displayed on the video screens; key messages will include:
 - No sales or distribution of cannabis products to minors
 - o Consumption of cannabis products by minors is not permitted
 - Do not overindulge in edible or smokeable products
 - Ensure adequate intake of non-cannabis infused food
 - o Display locations of first aid tents
 - o Consumption of alcohol onsite is not permitted
 - Drink lots of water
 - Practice sun safety (weather dependent)

Lighting

• Provide 3 light towers for evening illumination during event tear-down and clean up, and/or for lighting in the event of an emergency.

Contingencies

- Announcements to be made from the stage to clear access/egress routes for emergency responders if there is a medical emergency onsite.
- Will support evacuation measures by:
 - Ensuring access/egress routes are clear
 - Providing on-the-ground direction as instructed by emergency response personnel
 - Helping those who require additional assistance exiting the site

Park Board's position:

- The 420 event taking place on April 20 in Sunset Park is an unsanctioned event.
- The Park Board has been very consistent over the last 3 years that it does not feel this event is an appropriate use of park space. It violates our non-smoking by-laws and has negative impacts to regular park users, our facilities and residents.
- The Park Board has declined to give organizers a permit as the event does not meet our criteria, and violates our no-smoking by-laws in parks.
- We have worked with our partners at the City and VPD to encourage organizers to go to an alternative location such as the PNE, but thus far have not been successful.
- Despite our concerns we will do everything we can in cooperation with our partners at the City, VPD, VFRS etc. to ensure public safety and minimize public and park impacts during this event.
- As per last year the adjacent seawall, the Sunset Concession and the Aquatic Centre will be closed on April 20th.

Protecting Sunset Beach Park:

- We are looking at ways to better protect the turf in the park this year so the public does not experience a loss of use after the event.
- Organizers informed us today they are investing \$30K in 14,000 square feet in "Ultra Deck" a breathable, interlocking material that protects turf. The decking will extend from the front of the stage and down the four aisles of the booth area. It will be installed Apr. 19.
- The organizers are also required to protect the turf with sheets of plywood during the set up and tear down of event equipment.
- The stage infrastructure will be set up on a hill to avoid damage to the field area of the park.

Costs:

• Park Board and City of Vancouver are tracking all incremental costs related to managing this event and will report to Park Board and Council on those costs in the weeks following April 20th.

VPD's position:

 The VPD have advised us that due to the size of the crowds and the current "grey" zone regarding legality of marijuana they do not feel it's possible to prevent the crowd from gathering in our park.



- The VPD's top priority for a large scale event like this is to ensure public safety together with partners in Emergency Services and VFRS.
- The Vancouver Police Department, VFRS, City and Park Board and will be assigning additional resources to both Sunset Beach Park and the Vancouver Art Gallery.

Operational key messages:

- Additional resources have been assigned to Sunset Beach Park, including:
 - o Park Board operations staff will be on-site during set-up and tear-down to ensure Park Board assets, including grass areas, are protected
 - o Park Ranger crews will be positioned along the seawall starting at 7:00am to inform/educate park users about the initiative
 - o Lifeguards will be deployed to the event site
 - o Extra portable washrooms will be positioned at Sunset Beach Park to support the event
 - o Extra garbage bins will be also be deployed to the event site
 - o Sunset Beach Concession will be locked down for its protection
 - The Park Board and Vancouver Police Department have worked together to inform the local community about the protest:
 - Notification letters were distributed to nearby residents and businesses on April13
 - o Notification posters were distributed and displayed at the Vancouver Aquatic Centre and the West End Community Centre
 - o Vancouver Aquatic Centre will be closed for the day and customers have been informed of the closure
 - Sunset Beach Park will be subject to an intense post-event clean-up by Park Board operations staff (similar to approach used for Celebration of Light event)





Park Board's position:

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- The Park Board has declined to give organizers a permit as the event does not meet our criteria, and violates our no-smoking by-laws in parks.
- We have worked with our partners at the City and VPD to encourage organizers to go to an alternative location such as the PNE, but thus far have not been successful.
- Despite our concerns we will do everything we can in cooperation with our partners at the City, VPD, VFRS etc. to ensure public safety and minimize public and park impacts during this event.
- Why can't Park Rangers enforce by-laws and stop it from happening? The VPD has advised that due to the size of the crowds, it is not safe for Park Rangers or police to attempt to enforce non-smoking by-laws at the event.
- As per last year the adjacent seawall, the Sunset Concession and the Aquatic Centre will be closed on April 20th. The VAC will also be closed on April 19th for electrical upgrades.

Protecting Sunset Beach Park:

- We are looking at ways to better protect the wet and soggy turf in the park this year so the public does not experience a loss of use after the event.
- Organizers informed us today they are investing \$30K in 14,000 square feet in "Ultra Deck" a breathable, interlocking material that protects turf. The decking will extend from the front of the stage and down the four aisles of the booth area. It will be installed Apr. 19.
- The organizers are also required to protect the turf with sheets of plywood during the set up and tear down of event equipment.
- The stage infrastructure will be set up on a hill to avoid damage to the field area of the park.
- We are hopeful this avoids similar damage to the field as last year, where Sunset Park was closed for 6 weeks to do field mitigation.



Costs:

- Park Board and City of Vancouver are tracking all incremental costs related to managing this event and will report to Park Board and Council on those costs in the weeks following April 20th.
- Last year's event cost the City almost \$250 K, nearly \$40 K of those were Park Board costs. Of that bill, 4/20 organizers reimbursed the Park Board nearly \$7K for turf restoration.
