- 2. Any correspondence between the Park Board and the Dr. Sun Yat Sen Classical Garden regarding the attempts to capture the otter or rescue the koi.

Date range for the records – November 1, 2018 to December 3, 2018

Dear Howard and Nick,

We are curious about how you came to the decision to relocate the otter to the Fraser Valley (from CBC story below). We appreciate that he can't be released downtown but wondering why not in Stanley Park or another geographically closer location?

We are also wondering if you would share the name of the wildlife company you are working with, and suggest asking them to follow BC SPCA's <u>AnimalKind standards for humane wildlife control</u>. Standards 8 and 9 cover humane cage trapping and release.

You can also find otter - specific information in our Wildlife Control Best Practices <u>https://spca.bc.ca/wp-content/uploads/best-practices-river-otter-and-mink.pdf</u>

CBC: "Late Thursday afternoon it announced that it has hired a wildlife relocation expert to capture the critter and <u>send it</u> to a new home in the Fraser Valley. "That will provide it with the best habitat for a long and healthy life," the board said in a statement"

Hi Yann and Jeff

Here is the plan of action for today.

Ziggy, Chris, and Crystal will set up the one large otter trap today. We'll close the park as you have suggested and the staff can monitor the trap hourly. If the otter is trapped during regular work hours, it can be released at Prospect as Ziggy has suggested. I'll write up a sign to post on the gates and forward to you before posting.

If this doesn't work, maybe then look into draining the pond and boarding the koi at the Aquarium. I can follow up with the aquarium and see if this is a possibility.

Please edit as you wish:

As I see it, there are four options:

-Use electrified fencing around the ponds. This would be difficult to do, and may be of concern with the public, though the current can be turned on and off as needed.

-Move the koi to the aquarium (they did board the koi for us during the reconstruction of the pond area), drain the ponds. This would remove a source of food and water for the otter and it would eventually depart the area.

-Hire a professional trapper (EBB, Oliver Busby and company).

-In the interim, I could take a trap over to the garden and hope to get it before too many more casualties. I have one trap large enough for an otter. It's actually coyote sized so would need help to move it back and forth. I can show the staff how to set up the trap and figure out the best spot for it. The trap would have to be set up after hours, so it would be up to garden staff to do this. Our parks gardener, Dan, can check the trap first thing in the morning and let me know if there is an occupant and I can then come and move it. We may end up getting a raccoon or two...If we catch the otter, I would suggest release in Stanley Park, probably Prospect Point, as I've seen otters there and want the most distance away as possible. I would also suggest replacing the gated doors on the public part of the garden with solid doors, and checking the outside perimeter for any other possible entryway to prevent another, or same otter coming into the garden.

Tuesday, Nov 27

3:00pm — Plumping guys will arrive at the garden to close the drain.

6:00pm — Garden staff to meet with park rangers to check the traps

Wednesday, Nov 28

7:00am — Garden staff to meet with park rangers or a park board staff to check on the traps if the otter is not caught.

7:30am — Plumping guys return to open the drain and will return to close the drain when needed.

9:30am — Garden staff start taking the remaining koi out with the help of Vancouver Aquarium and Chris Lee. The remaining koi will be relocated to the Vancouver Aquarium.

6:00pm — Garden staff to meet with park rangers or a park board staff to check on the traps if the otter is not caught.

Thursday, Nov 29

7:00am-9:30am— Park board staff and the trapper will remove the traps in the Garden side.

10:00am — The garden will reopen to visitors. Business as usual...hopefully...

Here is the plan of action for today.

Ziggy, Chris, and Crystal will set up the one large otter trap today. We'll close the park as you have suggested and the staff can monitor the trap hourly. As I see it, there are four options:

-Use electrified fencing around the ponds. This would be difficult to do, and may be of concern with the public, though the current can be turned on and off as needed.

-Move the koi to the aquarium (they did board the koi for us during the reconstruction of the pond area), drain the ponds. This would remove a source of food and water for the otter and it would eventually depart the area.

-Hire a professional trapper (EBB, Oliver Busby and company).

-In the interim, I could take a trap over to the garden and hope to get it before too many more casualties. I have one trap large enough for an otter. It's actually coyote sized so would need help to move it back and forth. I can show the staff how to set up the trap and figure out the best spot for it. The trap would have to be set up after hours, so it would be up to garden staff to do this. Our parks gardener, Dan, can check the trap first thing in the morning and let me know if there is an occupant and I can then come and move it. We may end up getting a raccoon or two...If we catch the otter, I would suggest release in Stanley Park, probably Prospect Point, as I've seen otters there and want the most distance away as possible. I would also suggest replacing the gated doors on the public part of the garden with solid doors, and checking the outside perimeter for any other possible entryway to prevent another, or same otter coming into the garden.

Nick recommended calling Oliver Busby with EBB Consulting (has all the required permits to relocate from Province). Nick's worked with Oliver before on beaver issues.

Nick also said that it's not unusual for river otters to go deep into urban environments. It'll keep returning now that it had identified the pond as a food source.
