Hello Mayor and Council,

I am writing in response to request for background information regarding upcoming changes to traffic controls on the Adanac Overpass. Please see below the following brief summary from Engineering.

Staff anticipate that the barriers on the Adanac Overpass will be removed the week of February 4<sup>th</sup> 2019. However, the exact timing of the opening depends on crew scheduling and availability. Staff have been in contact with VPD, the Hastings-Sunrise Community Policing Centre, the Fire Department, the Coast Mountain Bus Company and ICBC to work toward a smooth return to the previous vehicle traffic patterns.

With monitoring and data collection now complete, staff are developing at least 3 options that could address concerns with vehicle speeds and volumes in the neighbourhood. Two or more of the options will not have restrictions on the Overpass, and 1 option will have a restriction on the Overpass. In April 2019, when staff have developed at least 3 feasible options, we will notify the neighbourhood and host a couple workshops to share the options and learn more about what could work well and what would be challenging for different residents. In addition, there will be opportunity for feedback through an online survey. Staff will use this feedback to help select a preferred option, as well as identify further issues to be addressed in a detailed design or implementation phase.
