Greetings Mayor and Council,

Apologies for the delayed reply.

The work to date on the retail kiosks has been done within existing policy direction for the area. Westbank understands that Council approval is required prior to implementation of the kiosks. However, to co-ordinate their construction schedule to their target deadline to launch the public realm, Westbank has requested to store the retail kiosks in the street right-of-way adjacent to Vancouver House, beginning August 30th. As such, they will be present on site prior to Council's consideration of the proposal to stop-up the street right-of-way. Staff have advised, and Westbank acknowledges, that the kiosks are placed on site at Westbank's risk, and that they assume the burden of removing them should the stop-up or any subsequent permits not be approved. Should removal be required Westbank could consider alternative uses for the containers such as other locations or applications.

Please see the attached memo from Jerry Dobrovolny. A short summary of the memo is as follows:

- This memo provides an update on the implementation of the new public realm under the Granville Street Bridge, adjacent to Westbank.s Vancouver House development (1412-1480 Howe St, 1429 Granville St, 1410 Granville St and 710 Pacific St.)
- To help animate the public realm, staff are collaborating with Westbank on the installation of micro-retail units Ā(MRUs), made from modified shipping containers.
- Installation of the MRU kiosks requires that part of the street right-of-way be stopped-up and closed. This stop-up requires approval by Council.
- The proposal to stop-up the street right-of way will be submitted to Council in October. The MRUs will arrive at the end of August and will be stored and fitted out for tenancy on site. Tenant occupancy and full launch of the public realm is currently scheduled for early 2020, subject to Council s approval of the stop-up.
