

There is currently a main break on a 200mm CI. The break is located at 300 Block E 2^{nd} Ave & there is damage to city infrastructure (asphalt road). Sodium thiosulphate has been deployed. Crew (C. Bergen) has arrived on site to repair the break. The water main has been throttled and there are approx. 2 properties that are affected.

Great Northern Way is fully reopened to traffic. Ministry of Environmental has been notified **DGIR 184110.**



INCIDENT TYPE:

Water main break - road closure, property damage - Great Northern Way FULLY REOPENED

DESCRIPTION:

Great Northern Way was reopened at approximately 9:00am after closure due to water escaping from a water main break (1951 8" cast iron main) which pushed water, mud and gravel downhill onto the roadway and created hazardous icy conditions. Roadway has been de-iced, swept and salted (thank you Streets and Sanitation). Waterworks crews onsite, continuing with clean up and hand salt surrounding affected residential area, including St. Francis Xavier School which was flooded and decided to close today due to the flood damage (Risk Management has been engaged). Water main repair is expected to be completed by end of shift today - this repair work does not affect Great Northern Way, the water main break is on E5th which is south of Great Northern Way.

IMMEDIATE PREVENTATIVE MEASURES:

Great Northern Way de-iced, swept and salted, reopened at 9:00am, water main throttled to limit escaping water to minimum and maintain positive pressure for water main repair (sodium thiosulphate deployed for dechlorination), crews onsite cleaning up mud/gravel and commencing water main repairs, Risk Management engaged.

STAKEHOLDERS INVOLVED:

Sanitation, Streets, VPD, Waterworks, Risk Management

PUBLIC IMPACT:

Great Northern Way fully reopened to vehicle and pedestrian traffic, St Francis Xavier School is closed due to flooding, one condominium building may need a temporary water feed while water main repairs being done (crew onsite to facilitate if needed).
