Re: Request for Access to Records under the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (The "Act")

Further to our email dated August 9, 2019 regarding your request for information with respect to:

- 1. Record showing expenditures of money collected through the Vacancy Tax, specifically:
- a. Names of organizations/corporations to which payments were made, and amounts paid to each;
- b. Amounts paid to individual renters facing eviction;
- c. Amounts paid for renter protection; and
- d. Amounts paid to match empty/underutilized homes and rooms with renters looking for housing.

Date Range: April 1, 2018 to August 9, 2019.

- 2. Revenue, capital and operating expenses for the Vacancy Tax, including:
- a. Records indicating revenue collected from the vacancy tax for 2017 and 2018;
- b. Any vacancy tax accounts receivable for 2017 and 2018;
- c. Number of properties which have been determined to be liable for the vacancy tax for 2017 and 2018; and
- d. Records indicating projected revenue and capital and operating costs related to the vacancy tax administration for 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, and 2023.

Part 1

For part 1a of your request, all responsive records are attached.

For parts b, c, and d of your request:

 On June 19, 2018, Council approved the allocation of the initial \$8 million net revenue collected for the 2017 Empty Homes Tax year, generally as outlined in Appendix E of the Report. Report can be found here: https://council.vancouver.ca/20180619/documents/rr1a.pdf

Please note: General Council allocation via Housing Vancouver to priority action areas is still subject to relevant procurement/granting processes.

Please note: The City is not able to provide financial grants or benefits directly to individual residents or renters. The City grants to non-profit organizations who administer support programs or services to individual residents.

- Pages 12 and 13 of the Appendix details the priority allocations for EHT funding. The specific funding allocations (relevant to your request) include:
 - Support for vulnerable renters, including:
 - \$100,000 of funding to support for renters facing eviction (Chapter 8, Key Strategy 1 of Housing Vancouver)
 - \$75,000 of funding for the Vancouver Rent Bank (Chapter 6, Key Strategy 1 of Housing Vancouver)
 - \$50,000 to Matching empty/underutilized homes and rooms with renters looking for housing (e.g. shared housing models like senior/student housing arrangements)
 - \$100,000 to Funding for skills training in peer support, affordable housing management, and asset training for residents of supportive housing (e.g. "Temporary Modular College" – temporary modular housing with on-site peer-based mentorship programming)
- To date, on April 23, 2019, Council has approved the grant of \$75,000 of EHT revenue to the Network of Inner City Community Services Society to support the operating costs of the Vancouver Rent Bank. Report can be found here: https://council.vancouver.ca/20190423/documents/a7.pdf
- Allocation of \$100,000 to Temporary Modular College is pending a future report back to Council.
- Allocation of \$100,000 of funding to support renters facing eviction and \$50,000 for a matching program are being advanced via the Council approved Renter Office) and will subject to a future Council report back.
