Subject: snow fight and winter weather update

Good Evening Mayor and Council:

All day we've had a full complement of salt and snow units working to clear major routes following last night's substantial accumulations across the city. Hundreds of additional staff from branches across Engineering Services have been hard at work hand shoveling throughout this afternoon. With such substantial and widespread accumulations across all areas of the city, it's been taking our crews some time to clear all major routes. The same scenario is playing out across our neighbouring municipalities in the Lower Mainland as crews work hard to catch up.

The expected snowfall has begun this afternoon and we can expect up to 12 centimetres across the city before the snow turns to light flurries around 10pm. If the break in the snow holds through the night as expected, the 30 salt and snow units on duty will have a much better chance of clearing the major routes in time for the morning commute. We will have 40-50 trucks out for tomorrow's daytime shift to continue to the work.

For Thursday, we're expecting rain and also a risk of freezing rain which we'll be treating with salt. Currently we've used 2,500 tonnes of the guaranteed 8,000 tonnes from our local supplier.

Currently the City's total forecast expenditures on snow response including tonight is approximately \$1.5 million, with approximately \$500,000 spent on salt.

EWR shelters

Last night Evelyne Saller Centre took in 62 people (over the 55 EWR beds available) but had to turn sever away to Powell Street Getaway.
Gathering Place took an extra 5 people into the shelter (from 30 to 35) and also let about 20 additional people (and pets) stay in the centre lobby so that no one was left outside.
Over the weekend, Evelyn Saller Centre was full at 55 people on both Saturday and Sunday. Six people were turned away one of the nights.
