Dear Mayor and Council,

I am writing to let you know that on Friday we will be launching the first iteration of VanDashboard – a collection of 65 key City of Vancouver performance metrics in six categories that will be available to the public via our Open Data Portal.

Some of you may have already had the opportunity to preview site during the internal pilot.

Many of the metrics are updated quarterly, while others are yearly measures. Where possible, targets are set and performance is measured against those targets.

The public can also drill down into the historical data and, using the City's Open Data Portal, can sort and view the data as they wish.

We plan to update the dashboard with new metrics over time, based on feedback. The public can ask questions or provide their feedback via the "Contact us" button at the bottom of the dashboard landing page.

We will be promoting the availability of the dashboard primarily online via our web site and social media, and we will also be issuing an Information Bulletin on Friday.
