	City taking measures to deal with COVID-19	
The City of Vancouver continues to work with internal and external partners, including Vancouver Coastal Health, on a proactive approach to deal with COVID-19.		
Right now, Vancouver Coastal Health and the BC Centre for Disease Control has said the risk of transmission in Vancouver remains low and the City of Vancouver will adjust our response based upon updated advice from public health officials.		
The health and safety of the public and City staff is our top priority. As such, out of an abundance of caution, the City of Vancouver is increasing cleaning protocols at our facilities, distributing signage and directing members of the public and staff to stay home if they are feeling sick.		
"We have a rigorous planning process in place for multiple scenarios, including a pandemic. We have been ramping up our plans over the past few weeks in anticipation of the spread of COVID-19," said City Manager Sadhu Johnston. "At this time we are not restricting public events at our facilities or in the community, however we are constantly in touch with provincial and local health authorities, monitoring the situation, and preparing to take further actions if we need to. Senior leaders are meeting regularly to address issues as they arise and make decisions that are best for our teams and the community. Under the leadership of the Vancouver Emergency Management Agency (VEMA), we have also activated the Emergency Operations Centre."
